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1. INTRODUCTION

On October 18, 2016, a public scoping meeting for Phase 1 of the Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan was held to provide the public with information about the study scope and schedule, opportunities for the public to participate in the planning study, and to listen to the public and gather feedback regarding flooding and flood-related issues experienced in the Jersey Village area. Further information regarding the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting is detailed below.

1.1. PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan (Plan) is an accelerated flood damage reduction study led by Dannenbaum Engineering Corporation (Dannenbaum) to address repetitive flooding in the City of Jersey Village (City) and the surrounding area. Flooding in the City is a persistent hazard for area residents, businesses, and property owners. Devastating flooding in the Jersey Village area has been documented five times in the last two decades, despite many efforts by the City and the Harris County Flood Control District to address flooding issues. In September 2016, the City contracted Dannenbaum to rapidly deliver the Plan by summer 2017.

The study team is comprised of experts in hydrology, civil engineering, environmental science, and public outreach. The study team will assess current conditions within the City and surrounding areas and identify and analyze potential strategies that could address repetitive flooding issues within the City.

The planning process will be delivered in three phases, and the community will be invited to attend a public meeting during each study phase:

- Phase 1: Data Collection and Preliminary Assessment (September – October 2016)
- Phase 2: Technical Analysis and Development of Alternatives (October 2016 – March 2017)
- Phase 3: Preferred Alternative Selection and Finalization (March – June 2017)

The goal of the study is to recommend a hydraulically, economically, environmentally, and socially feasible Plan that is acceptable to City residents and elected officials. Throughout the life of the study, the study team will proactively encourage public feedback and participation. A total of three public meetings will be held during the planning process to provide information about the Plan and receive input from affected communities.

2.PUBLIC SCOPING MEETING PROCESS

The City of Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting process consisted of the following elements:

- A public notice and web banner announcing the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting were published on the City of Jersey Village website.
- Emails announcing the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting were distributed to elected officials.
- E-blasts announcing the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting were distributed to the City of Jersey Village email list.
- A letter was mailed to 2,437 addresses located in the City of Jersey Village announcing the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting and providing information about the Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire included in the mailing. The questionnaire was designed to solicit input on flooding observed by local residents to provide the study team with the critical data necessary to conduct technical analysis during Phase 2 of the study.
- A version of the Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire was also made available online and solicited questions identical to the mailed flooding questionnaire. The link to the online questionnaire was provided to participants via the e-blasts distributed to the City of Jersey Village email list. The online questionnaire link was also prominently displayed on the mailed copy of the questionnaire, on the informational letter mailed with the questionnaire, and on the “How to Participate” handout and study newsletter distributed at the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting.
- The Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting was hosted to provide the public with information about the scope and schedule, opportunities for the public to participate in the planning study, and to listen to the public and gather feedback regarding flooding and flood-related issues experienced in the Jersey Village area.
- All comments received during the comment period, and those received after the comment period to the extent practicable, were reviewed and considered. The deadline to receive comments for consideration during Phase 2 of the study was Wednesday, November 16, 2016
- The Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting Summary was published on the City of Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan Website (www.JVFloodRecovery.com).

3. PUBLIC NOTIFICATIONS

The public was notified about the City of Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting via an online public notice, web banner, yard signs, e-blasts, and a public notice mailed with the Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire as described below.

3.1. PUBLIC NOTICE

A public notice announcing the date, time, and location of the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting (**Appendix A**) was published on the City website on Monday, October 8, 2016, and distributed to local elected officials and first responders via email for stakeholder notification on social media websites (i.e. Nextdoor, Facebook, and Twitter). The public notice also included information about the format and purpose of the meeting and solicited verbal and written comments at the meeting or via email at JVfloodRecovery@crouchenvironmental.com.

3.2. ELECTED OFFICIALS NOTICE

A total of seven state and federal elected officials were notified of the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting via email on October 11, 2016. Copies of the emails and the elected official database are included in **Appendix B**.

3.3. WEB BANNER

In addition to the public notice, a web banner was designed and published on the City website on Monday, October 8, 2016. The web banner included the name of the Plan and announced the date, time, and location of the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting. A copy of the web banner is included in **Appendix A**.

3.4. YARD SIGNS

Before the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting, yard signs announcing the date, time, and location of the meeting were placed along frequently traveled roadways and thoroughfares in the Jersey Village area. Additionally, meeting details were announced on all City designated marquees. A copy of the yard signs is included in **Appendix A**.

3.5. E-BLAST

E-blasts were distributed to the City of Jersey Village email list on Thursday, October 13, 2016, and Tuesday, October 18, 2016. All Jersey Village area residents are given the opportunity to be included on the City's contact list. Both e-blasts were identical and announced the date, time, and location of the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting, the purpose of the public meeting, the study comment deadline, and how to submit comments. A copy of the e-blast is included in **Appendix A**.

3.6. MAILED LETTER AND FLOODING QUESTIONNAIRE

A letter was mailed to 2,437 addresses located in the City of Jersey Village announcing the upcoming Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting and providing information about the Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire included in the mailing. The letter announced the date, time, and location of the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting (**Appendix G**). The letter also included information about the format and purpose of the meeting, solicited verbal and written comments, and encouraged recipients to take the enclosed flooding questionnaire.

The Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire included in the mailing was designed to solicit input on flooding observed by local residents to provide the study team with the critical data necessary to conduct technical analysis during Phase 2 of the study. More details about the mailed flooding questionnaire can be found in **Section 5.1**.

4. PUBLIC SCOPING MEETING SUMMARY

The Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting for the City of Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan took place on Tuesday, October 18, 2016, at Jersey Village City Hall, 16327 Lakeview Drive, Jersey Village, TX 77040, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The public scoping meeting was held in a town hall style. Upon arrival, attendees were asked to complete an attendee card and were provided with meeting materials including the first edition of the study newsletter, a “How to Participate” handout, a written comment form, and a copy of the Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire. A total of 196 people completed attendee cards. An attendee database is included in **Appendix C**, and copies of the completed attendee cards are included in **Appendix D**. Copies of meeting materials can be found in **Appendix J**.

The public scoping meeting began with a formal presentation (**Appendix K**) by Dannenbaum about the purpose, need, and goal of the study, as well as the process moving forward. Following the formal presentation, attendees were invited to offer verbal and written comments, complete a survey, view informational display stations around the room, provide feedback on study region maps, and discuss the study with study team representatives from the City and Dannenbaum. Display stations provided information about the planning process, flooding in Jersey Village, and flood damage reduction methods. Copies of display materials are included in **Appendix L**, and photographs of the scoping meeting are included in **Appendix M**.

During the town hall, the public was invited to offer verbal comments following the formal presentation. Attendees wishing to offer verbal comments were required to sign-up and were called to speak in the order in which they registered. Speakers were each provided with three minutes to speak and were asked to state and spell their first and last name before speaking. The planning team did not provide responses to verbal comments; however, all comments were recorded by a court reporter and will be considered. Following the verbal commenting period, attendees were invited to engage study team members in discussion about problems and

opportunities and ask questions. Attendees were invited to submit written comments at the scoping meeting or at any time during the comment period via mail or email.

5. PHASE 1 COMMENTS RECEIVED

5.1. COMMENT COLLECTION METHODS

All comments received during the comment period, and those received after the comment period to the extent practicable, were reviewed and considered. The comment deadline for Phase 1 was Wednesday, November 16, 2016. Comments were received via several channels including:

- Verbal comments were accepted at the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting. Speakers were provided with three minutes to speak, and all comments were recorded by a court reporter. The legal transcript of the verbal comments made at the public meeting prepared by the court reporter is included in **Appendix N**.
- Comment forms were submitted at the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting or mailed to Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan, 402 Teetshorn St., Houston, TX 77009. Copies of the scanned comment forms are included in **Appendix F**.
- Comments and media records (**Appendix F**) of flooding in Jersey Village were accepted via email at jvfloodrecovery@crouchenvironmental.com.
- Data and comments about flooding observed by local residents were received via the online Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire at www.jvfloodsurvey.com
- Copies of the Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire (**Appendix G**) were mailed to 2,437 addresses on Wednesday, October 12, 2016, and physical copies of the questionnaire were handed out at the Phase 1 Public Scoping Meeting. The questionnaire was designed to solicit input on flooding observed by local residents to provide the study team with the critical data necessary to conduct technical analysis during Phase 2 of the study. Completed copies of the Jersey Village Flooding Questionnaire as well as media recording flooding in Jersey Village were submitted via mail to Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan, 402 Teetshorn St., Houston, TX 77009, delivered to the receptionist on duty at the City of Jersey Village Municipal Government Center located at 16327 Lakeview Dr., Jersey Village, TX, 77040, or placed in the drop box for Jersey Village water and sewer payments located on the street side of the City of Jersey Village Municipal Government Center next to the U.S. Mail collections box.

Flooding in the City of Jersey Village

Flooding in the City of Jersey Village is a persistent hazard for area residents, businesses, and property owners. Devastating flooding in the Jersey Village area has been documented five times in the last two decades, despite many efforts by the City of Jersey Village and the Harris County Flood Control District to address flooding issues.

In the last 18 years, the City of Jersey Village has spent more than \$25 million to address localized street drainage issues, and the Harris County Flood Control District has spent approximately \$95 million within the White Oak Bayou watershed to alleviate flooding. Projects led and implemented by the Harris County Flood Control District include the Jersey Village Channel (a diversion channel located north of the City proper) and multiple detention basins within and upstream of Jersey Village.

Most recently, more than 200 Jersey Village homes were flooded during the April 2016 “Tax Day” rainfall event. Due to the repetitive flooding experienced in the Jersey Village area, the City is now moving forward with the Long-term Flood Recovery Plan.

About the Long-term Flood Recovery Plan

The Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan is an accelerated flood damage reduction study led by the City of Jersey Village to address repetitive flooding in the City and the surrounding area. In September 2016, the City contracted Dannenbaum Engineering Corporation to rapidly deliver the Long-term Flood Recovery Plan by spring 2017.

The Long-term Flood Recovery Plan study team is comprised of experts in hydrology, civil engineering, environmental science, and public outreach, and this team will work hand-in-hand with the Jersey Village community to develop an effective flood damage reduction plan to serve the community for years to come.

The Long-term Flood Recovery Plan study team will assess current conditions within the City of Jersey Village and surrounding areas, then the team will identify and analyze potential strategies that could address repetitive flooding issues within the City.

The planning process will be delivered in three phases, and the community will be invited to attend a public meeting during each study phase:

- **Phase 1:** Data Collection and Preliminary Assessment
- **Phase 2:** Technical Analysis and Development of Alternatives
- **Phase 3:** Preferred Alternative Selection and Finalization

Throughout the life of the study, the Long-term Flood Recovery Plan study team will proactively encourage public feedback and participation. Public input is a critical part of creating a successful plan that reflects the community’s desires and interests.

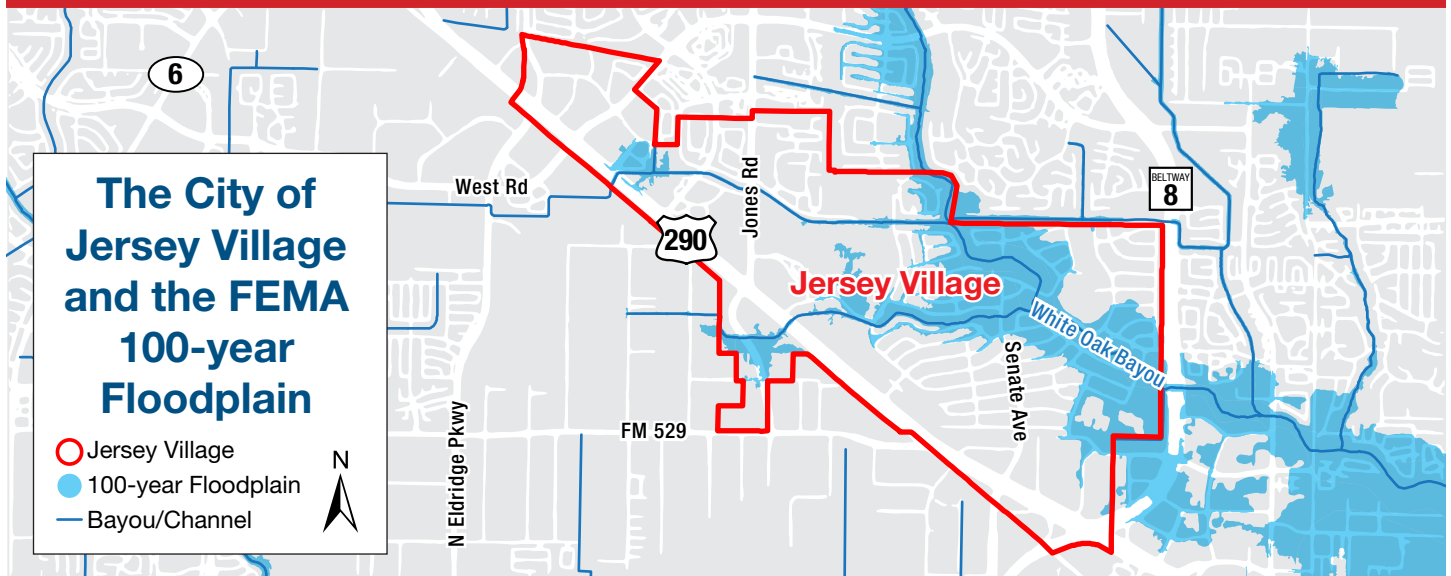

Flooding in the City of Jersey Village

Flooding in the City of Jersey Village is a persistent hazard for area residents, businesses, and property owners. Devastating flooding in the Jersey Village area has been documented five times in the last two decades, despite many efforts by the City of Jersey Village and the Harris County Flood Control District to address flooding issues.

In the last 18 years, the City of Jersey Village has spent more than \$25 million to address localized street drainage issues, and the Harris County Flood Control District has spent approximately \$95 million

within the White Oak Bayou watershed to alleviate flooding. Projects led and implemented by the Harris County Flood Control District include the Jersey Village Channel (a diversion channel located north of the City proper) and multiple detention basins within and upstream of Jersey Village.

Most recently, more than 200 Jersey Village homes were flooded during the April 2016 “Tax Day” rainfall event. Due to the repetitive flooding experienced in the Jersey Village area, the City is now moving forward with the Long-term Flood Recovery Plan.

About the Long-term Flood Recovery Plan

The Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan is an accelerated flood damage reduction study led by the City of Jersey Village to address repetitive flooding in the City and the surrounding area. In September 2016, the City contracted Dannenbaum Engineering Corporation to rapidly deliver the Long-term Flood Recovery Plan by summer 2017.

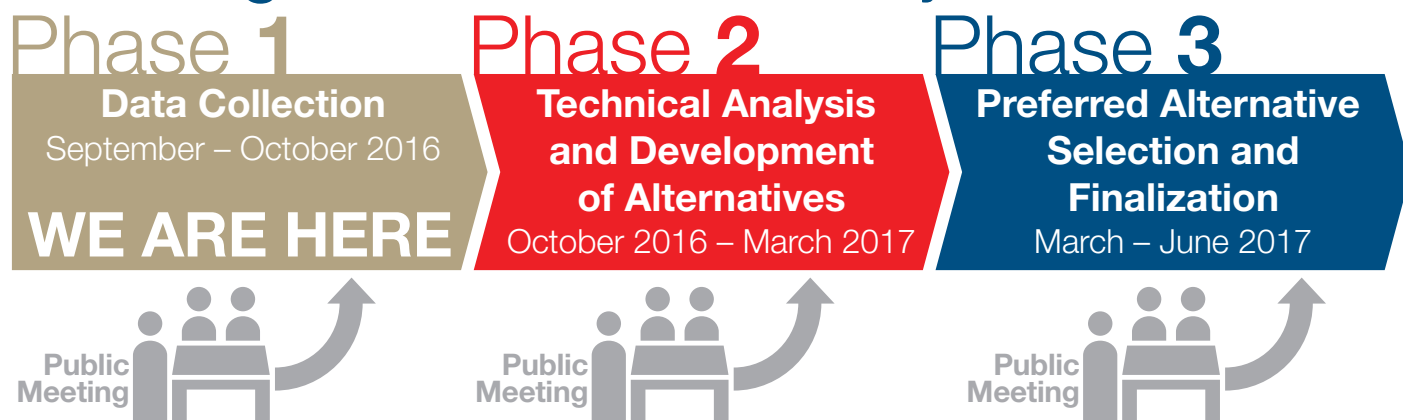
The Long-term Flood Recovery Plan study team is comprised of experts in hydrology, civil engineering, environmental science, and public outreach, and this team will work hand-in-hand with the Jersey Village community to develop an effective flood damage reduction plan to serve the community for years to come.

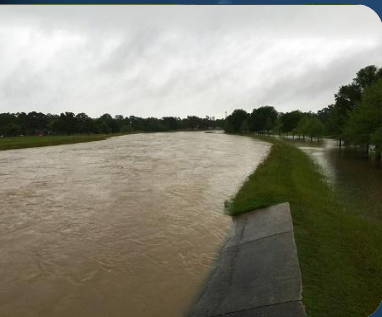

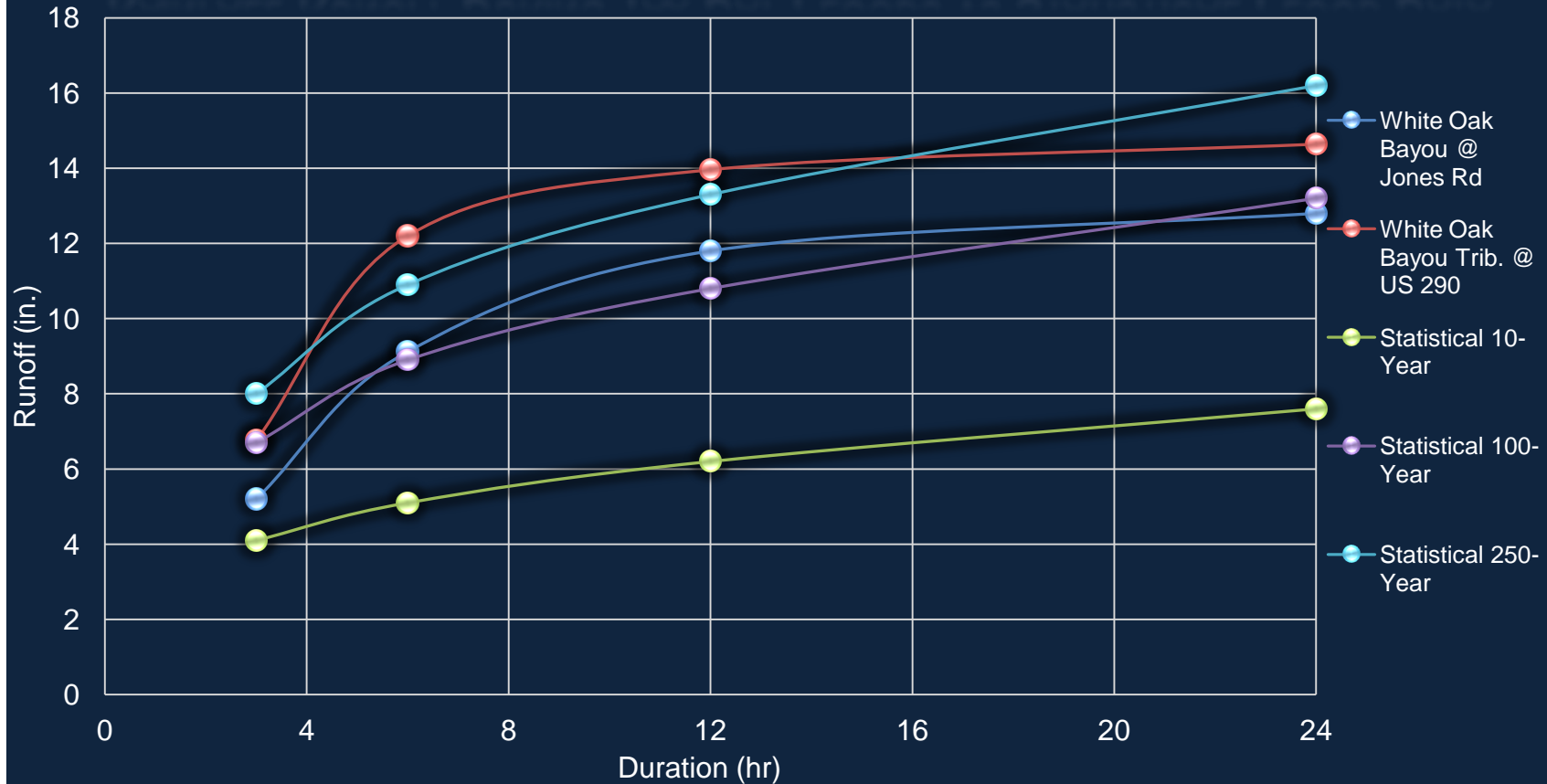

RAINFALL RUNOFF DURING TAX DAY FLOODS VS STATISTICAL FLOOD DATA

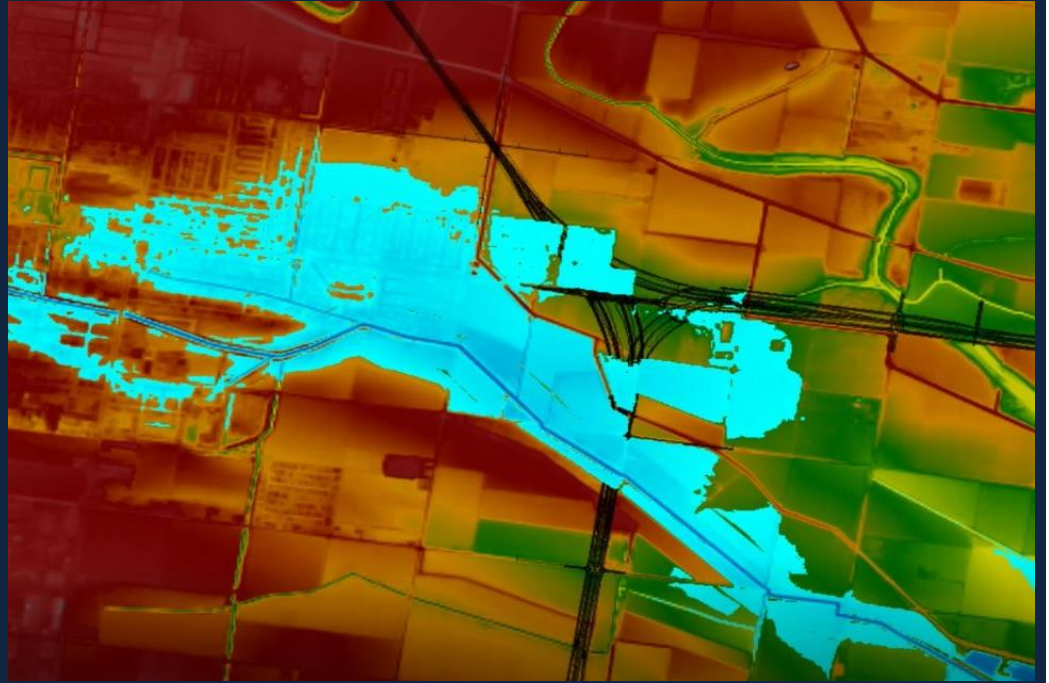

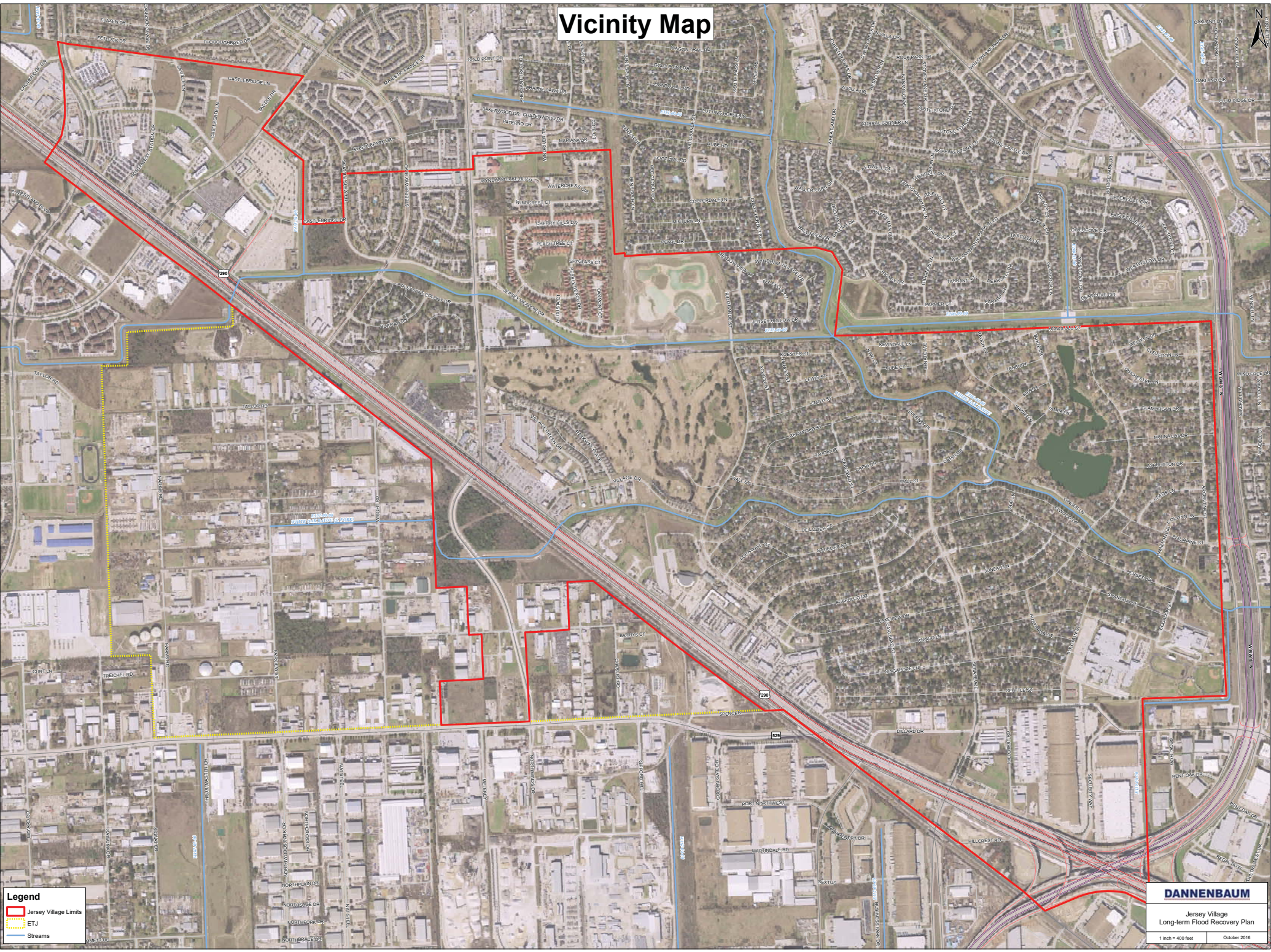

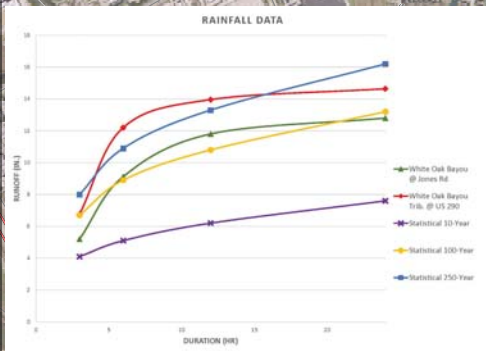

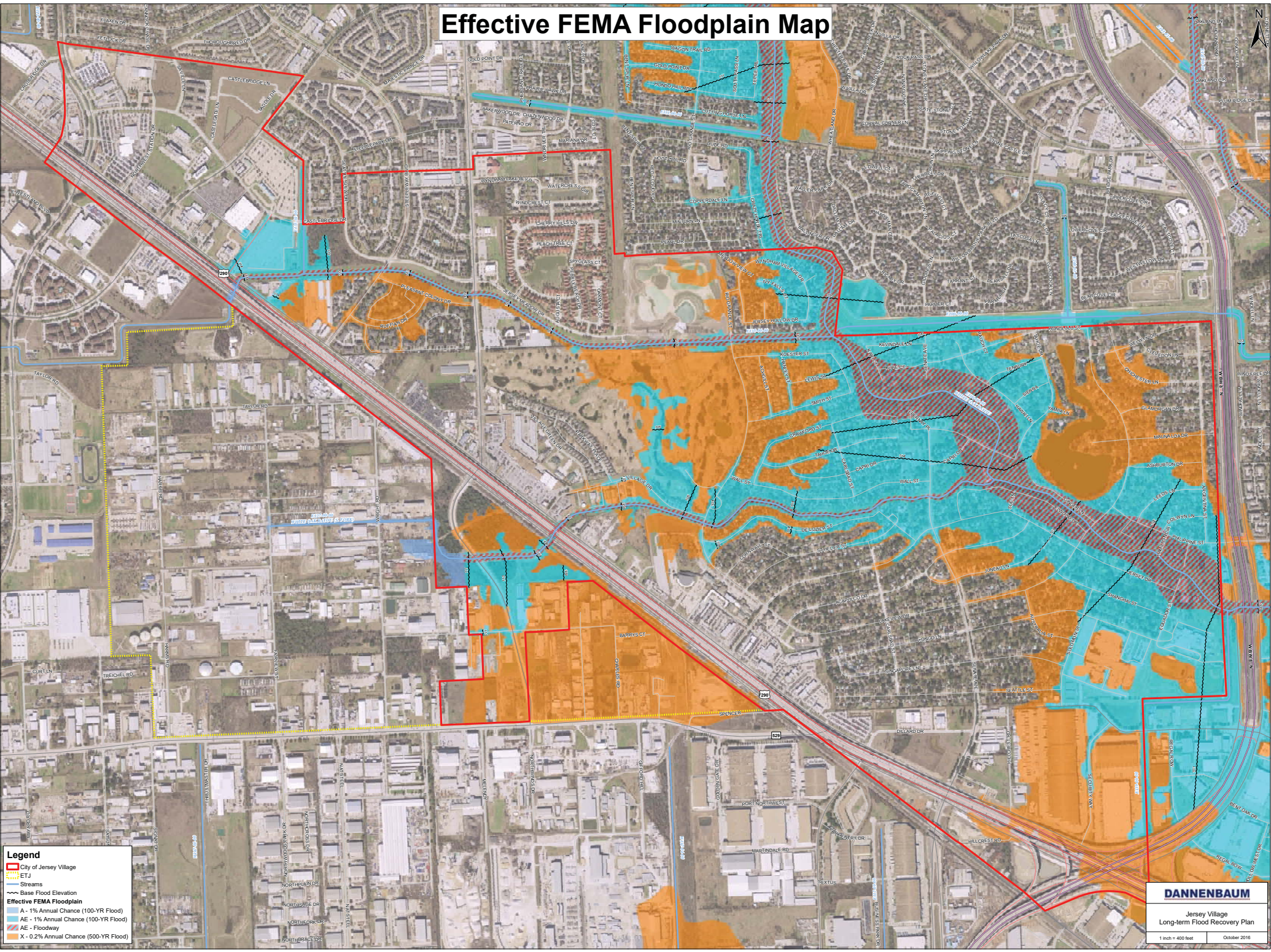

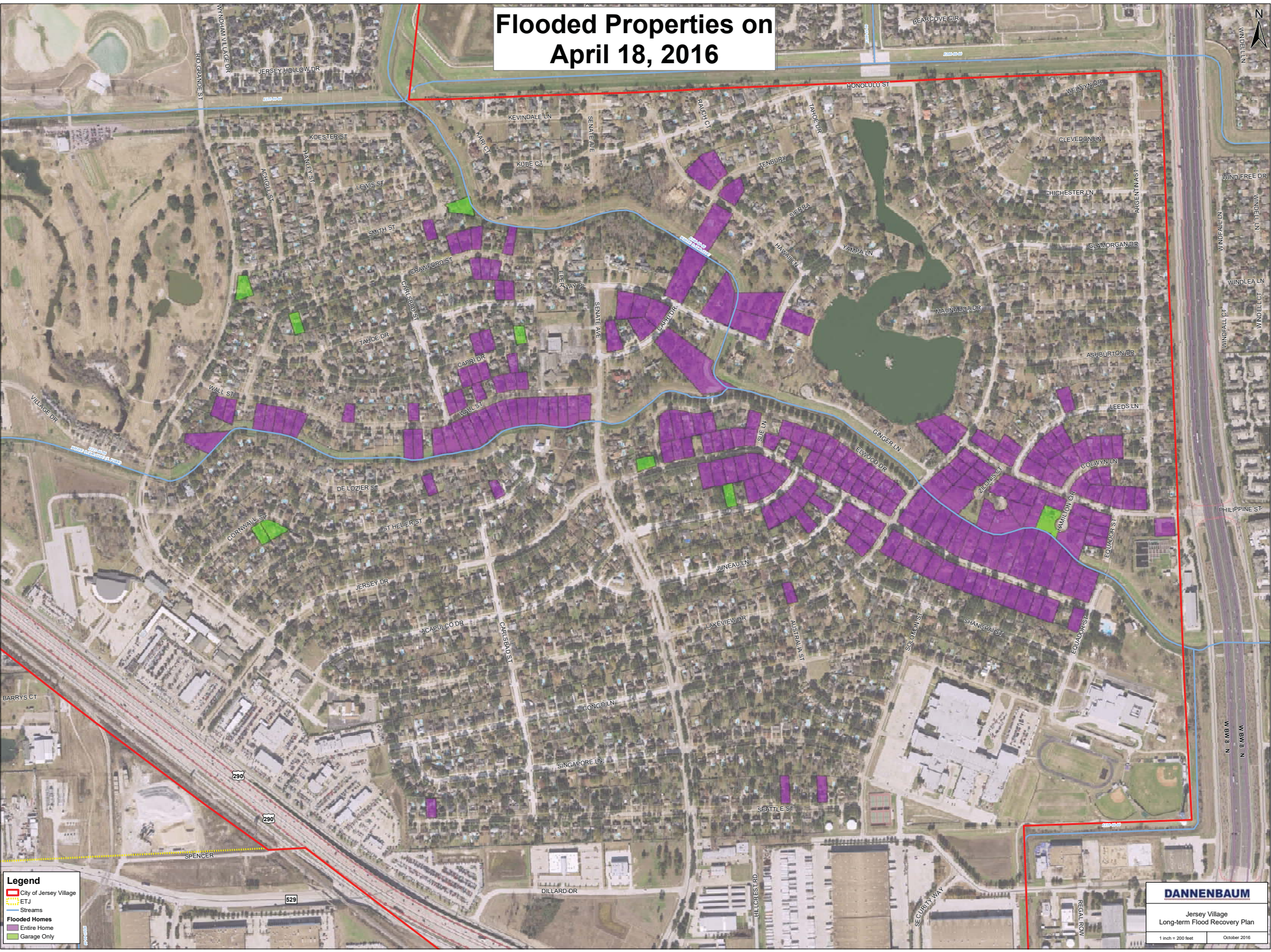

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FRED ZIEHE

Good evening. My name is Fred Ziehe, Z-I-E-H-E.

I live at 8409 Hawaii Lane. I'm a member of the Citizens' Committee, "Residents Working to Improve Jersey Village." It's our opinion that the main factors contributing to flooding in Jersey Village are the result of:

1) Large volumes of flood waters moving downstream from the 18 square mile upper reach of White Oak Bayou. This was never so evident than during the recent floods we had on Sunday, August 14 of this year. During this rain, only 2.7 inches of rain fell on Jersey Village, yet, the flood waters rose within four feet of the top of the bank. There's no way a small amount of rain caused the high rise in our channel. However, upstream of Jersey Village the rains were more severe. In fact, 8.4 inches of rain was reported upstream of us. This is why it's critical that Dannebaum in concert with Flood Control consider the entire drainage area in their engineering modeling and study. And in question, are more detention ponds identified and scheduled by the county upstream of Jersey Village?

2) The channels through Jersey Village are not as wide as they are directly upstream and downstream of Jersey Village. This is evident on satellite pictures

1 of the area and by walking along the bayou. And I
2 provided Dannenbaum a picture of Google Map that shows
3 that our bayou is not half as large as upstream and
4 downstream.

5 This was obvious during the Tax Day Flood. The
6 flood waters stayed in bank directly upstream of the X
7 zone in Jersey Village in the Willow Bridge area and
8 also directly downstream of Jersey Village east of the
9 Beltway. Yet, the same flood waters came out of the
10 bank by two and a half feet through Jersey Village,
11 flooding in excess of 225 homes.

12 The narrowing of the channels through Jersey
13 Village is causing the flooding we experience. Too much
14 water is being directed to a narrow channel at the X,
15 which is a pinch zone. Widening, deepening, removing
16 excess sediment, and benching of the channels and/or
17 adding berms to the channels throughout Jersey Village
18 are absolute necessities to mitigating the flooding
19 issues here in Jersey Village. They're not just
20 options; they are requirements.

21 Considering enlarging the Flood Control's
22 easements along the bayou in order to allow widening of
23 the bayou. Consider steepening the banks of the bayou
24 to more than three to one slope ratio, with concrete
25 sides or other stone materials to allow for widening in

1 the narrow easements.

2 And why have channels in Jersey Village never
3 been widened even though they are on the Flood Control's
4 list of projects, which are approved projects but just
5 not yet funded?

6 45 degrees and 90 degrees turns throughout the
7 bayou system in Jersey Village are slowing the water
8 exiting the city and thereby contributing to the
9 flooding. Videos taken during the Tax Day Flood show
10 waters flowing down Hawaii. This demonstrates that the
11 bayou came out of bank in the Kari Court, flowed down
12 Honolulu, and then turned onto Hawaii. Same thing
13 happened on other streets.

14 Higher water levels have been witnessed by
15 homeowners along the south tributary ever since the
16 Elwood Weir or drop structure was constructed. It's
17 also slowing down the water trying to exit Jersey
18 Village. The need for this structure or at least the
19 dimensions of it should be reconsidered.

20 The effectiveness of the bypass must be
21 re-evaluated. It had excess capacity available to move
22 more water during the Tax Day Flood. The flood waters
23 were about six feet below the top of bank, during the
24 same time that Jersey Village was being flooded. It's
25 moving some water from the main channel but not nearly

1 enough. In addition, more water is entering the bypass
2 from the Willow Bridge area downstream by the iron walk
3 bridge.

4 Numerous citizens have reported water
5 back-flowing from the bayou through street drains,
6 causing flooding into the streets and then into the
7 homes. Now, this is on Wall Street and others. Check
8 valves must be considered.

9 More water appears to be coming down the south
10 tributary from the area of west of the Jones Road
11 Extension Area and west of 290, and will only increase
12 as the expansion is completed.

13 Evaluate the underutilization of the Jersey
14 Meadow Golf Course detention pond and any other
15 detention ponds in our area. Utilize the Jersey Meadow
16 Golf Course for flood mitigation while still preserving
17 the course.

18 Build a berm to prevent flow, enlarge water
19 hazards on the course to detain water flows, construct
20 underground water storage, construct underground water
21 storage below Wall Street, Rio Grande, Honolulu, Hawaii,
22 and other streets to store water during the storms. And
23 reconsider the flooding impact for any new home
24 development starts within the city limits of Jersey
25 Village, particularly those near the bayou drainage.

1 Please give these items and ideas consideration
2 during the course of your study. Thank you.

3 KEN MAGEE

4 I'm Ken Magee. I live at 16334 Acapulco. This
5 March I will have lived here 40 years. During that 40
6 years I've had the unfortunate circumstances of having
7 witnessed four devastating floods in Jersey Village.
8 After looking back on these four floods I found that
9 there were at least two things that were common in all
10 four floods.

11 The first flood is they all four occurred in the
12 midnight hours during the dark of the night, which
13 caused a lot of people to have a very, very unfortunate
14 surprise the next morning. The second thing that was
15 common for all four floods is they all four flooded in
16 virtually the same location. That tells me that this is
17 the major issue of the flood that's what's causing the
18 flooding. That flood location is about 100 to 200 yards
19 on either side of the Lakeview bridge, both above and
20 below Lakeview bridge.

21 Continuing flooding there is due to the fact that
22 the channel through Jersey Village is too small. It
23 needs to be widened and deepened desperately. The Flood
24 Control District is going to do that. Their project is
25 now number one on their list of projects, and it will be

1 done as soon as they get money. The problem with the
2 Flood Control District's widening of the bayou or the
3 channel is that they're only going to widen it to the
4 extent that they have right-of-way. The right-of-way
5 that the Flood Control District has is roughly about
6 four feet on each side of the bayou, which is woefully
7 inadequate. What is needed is additional right-of-way.

8 The Flood Control District is not very interested
9 in acquiring that right-of-way. It is going to fall on
10 our shoulders, the City of Jersey Village, who acquires
11 that right-of-way. I expect the engineering studies to
12 look at this and come up with a plan.

13 Now, it needs to be widened to the maximum extent
14 possible, but because of the requirements that the Flood
15 Control District has, they're only going to let you
16 widen it to the extent it doesn't harm people
17 downstream. The engineering company needs to find out
18 exactly what those dimensions are, and they need to
19 develop a method in a situation whereby we can
20 acquire -- land owners -- ownership from them of the
21 right-of-way. That's going to take everybody's lot
22 that's on either side of the bayou through the main
23 channel is going to have to contribute to the cost, it
24 looks to me like. That's all I have to say.

25 MICHAEL BROM

1 Hi, my name is Mike Brom. I live at 16025 Wall
2 Street, and I've lived there for a little over 23 years
3 now. Unfortunately, I've had water in my bedroom four
4 almost five times now. In 2009 I was -- it came all the
5 way up to the slab and then drained away. So I guess I
6 only had it in the garage.

7 I can't compete with what these guys said
8 because -- well, I would just be repeating what they're
9 saying because I agree 100 percent with everything they
10 said. I'd like to add that the channel along Wall
11 Street is changing the nature of the way the stuff works
12 as time goes by. It has never -- I've never had water
13 come in from that channel into my home. It always
14 spills from the main channel, comes and backs up in the
15 street, and then drains away to the rear, out the
16 tributary.

17 This year it wasn't like that. After five and a
18 half inches of rain on dry ground, the main channel was
19 three feet within the top of the bank. It hadn't
20 spilled yet. I went to move my cars. Opened my front
21 door, there's water already on my slab, and that has
22 never happened before. So the runoff from the Jones
23 Road Extension and the 290 construction, whatever, it
24 was different this year than the previous three floods
25 that we've had.

1 Flood Control records, looking at radar, looking at old
2 topo maps and things long before this study ever got
3 started, and I was part of that group and still am.

4 What I want to talk about now is not only my support
5 for these gentlemen, but also some observations that
6 were made, as Mike Brom alluded to, after the flood. If
7 you remember, it was April 15th or around there. Tax
8 Day Flood is when we had our disaster, but a few weeks
9 later we also had some tremendous rainfall. Everybody
10 was watching the flood gauges and wondering, my god, I'm
11 going to have to go through this again.

12 Myself and three members of the other members of
13 the flood group here, we got up, we put our hip waders
14 on, and we went out in the middle of the storm. And it
15 was thundering and lightning. Where we went was up to
16 that area that Fred talked about -- it was up around
17 Kevindale and where the X is -- to observe exactly what
18 was happening with the bayou waters at that time because
19 we were very, very close to flooding.

20 What I saw and what the other fellows saw was on
21 White Oak Bayou in the Jersey Village limit, it was
22 about 18 inches from going over bank. We walked to the
23 north where they called it the X, but actually it's a
24 peninsula that actually directs water coming from White
25 Oak Bayou to the north, which is much wider. And it

1 separates some of that water to the bypass over towards
2 the Beltway.

3 The water that was coming down White Oak Bayou
4 was moving at quite a good quip. The water that was
5 going into the bypass was moving very very slowly. In
6 other words, what that meant is the bypass was full and
7 it didn't have enough slope to really move that water.
8 So the majority of the water was coming into Jersey
9 Village right there, and there was more water coming in
10 from the tributary over near the golf course. That
11 added together had 18 inches of water to go here in
12 Jersey Village. It had about four and a half feet
13 before going over bank on the bypass. That's a key area
14 we have to look at.

15 In closing, I will say when you do have these
16 torrentuous rainstorms, please, get out, look around,
17 observe because it's not just what you see during the
18 flooding; it's what you see at other times that will
19 really help these guys do their jobs. Thank you.

20 MICHAEL HESTER

21 Good evening, everyone. These men have done an
22 awesome job. Frankly, my comments are going to be
23 relatively elementary compared to what they said. I
24 live on 15710 Honolulu Street. A couple of years after
25 we moved in 2001, we had Allison. We had 9 or 10 inches

1 on the Monday it rained, and then another 10 inches of
2 rain on Friday night, and that continued through until
3 our home started flooding.

4 My house actually backed up to what was then the
5 Harris County detention pond. It was actually a
6 T-shape, went over to (inaudible) bridge. My house
7 actually flooded from the rear. I live on the crown of
8 Honolulu. I was in Zone S. There wasn't any
9 possibility I could flood. Somebody forgot to tell
10 them, the flood itself.

11 What I noticed is I live -- since I live on that
12 bypass I've been able to observe how ineffective it is.
13 I've also seen that it's got some of the worst
14 maintenance of anybody in this area. But it isn't as
15 bad as the primary White Oak Bayou. The signs are
16 falling in. It's always loaded up with grass. In fact,
17 the center of the bypass that I live on commonly has
18 weeds 10 to 12 feet tall.

19 So in support of these gentlemen, they have
20 excellent recommendations of a long term. I'm thinking
21 something has to be done right now. I mean, if it means
22 getting some mowers out and some men with weed eaters to
23 get in there on a regular basis, clean the thing out.
24 You can have wonderful plumbing in your house, but if
25 you throw a few diapers down your toilet, you're

1 probably going to clog it. So what I would think is
2 certainly the sides -- the Capri/Tahoe Street bridge
3 that I cross several times a day, you can watch the
4 sides are actually literally falling down.

5 Now, one of the improvements they made was the
6 concrete reinforcement in the turn. So I would think if
7 you can do an additional amount of concrete reinforcing
8 combined with the widening, I think we can see some more
9 short-term improvement, and then we can continue to work
10 on the long term. Thank you.

11 LEONDRE LeDOUX

12 My name is Leondre LeDoux. I am with Texas
13 Recovering Together. What we are is a crisis counseling
14 program and offer relief to survivors of the most recent
15 floods. We don't just do crisis counseling; we do
16 resources. I know resources is a major thing that is
17 the event at this point in time. I know you guys are
18 hearing a lot about the infrastructures, but we give
19 actual assistance. We link you to places they give you,
20 the assistance that you need. If you need us, our
21 number is 1(844)279-6036. The table out front to my
22 right is the team. They'll get you information.
23 They'll contact you. It's a free service. We are
24 funded by FEMA, and we work directly with the State.

25 How many of you guys are familiar with MHMRA?

1 The new name is The Harris Center for Mental Health and
2 IDD. And we work directly under them. So it is a City
3 of Houston thing, it is a Harris County thing, and we
4 are here to help. Thank you.

5 LEZIGA S. POI

6 Good evening. Leondre here, he was able to talk
7 to you -- basically give you an idea of our program, so
8 I really don't have that much to talk about, but I would
9 like to remind you that we basically do crisis
10 counseling and then we do case manager. So the way the
11 program is set up is we will come to you; you don't have
12 to come to us. All you have to do is contact us and
13 tell us what your needs are, and we will meet you
14 halfway however you want us to be able to assist you.

15 We would like it if you could contact us.
16 Nothing is too little and nothing is too large. We are
17 willing to do whatever we can do for this community.
18 Talking to my staff members, we came here because we
19 weren't getting that much calls from this area. So we
20 came over here just to find out what was going on, and
21 luckily we were invited to come here tonight. So it's a
22 pleasure being here, and I would really appreciate the
23 fact that you guys will give us an opportunity to come
24 over and meet with you tonight. Thank you.

25 MICHAEL STEMBRIDGE

1 Hi. Michael Stembridge. I live at 15422 Jersey
2 Drive. I was wondering -- first of all, I would like to
3 thank the Jersey Village Police Department and Jersey
4 Village Fire Department, as well as the City for all
5 their massive efforts in just caring about all of us as
6 human beings through this whole tragedy.

7 My question is, similar to the gentlemen, the
8 people that spoke, can we increase the rate of flow of
9 White Oak Bayou as it drains through Jersey Village by
10 creating horizontal overflow and drain-off points in the
11 huge detention basins by the apartments past Beltway 8
12 and Clark Henry Park between Philippine and Gessner.
13 There are two or more -- there's a set of detention
14 basins behind the apartments. One on each side of White
15 Oak Bayou; one to the left and one to the right.

16 They are both currently full of big trees right
17 now. Maybe we should dig cut-throughs and remove the
18 trees from those basins parallel to Philippine, and make
19 it into one huge treeless basin that accommodates
20 massive water and rain volume; thereby, alleviating
21 Jersey Village, White Oak Bayou and surrounding
22 neighborhoods.

23 I'm not sure about this, but I think there were
24 no floods from 2001 to 2016. There may have been
25 floods, but -- I know Allison was the bad one, and then

1 there was the Tax Day Flood, possibly due to Gessner and
2 Philippine and to the basins. I'm talking about just
3 past the Beltway feeder, just past Clark Henry Park.

4 It's a little bit ironic that we flood again the
5 three years subsequent to those hundreds of basin trees
6 being planted. I'm wondering what the purpose of those
7 trees is. And those are -- those are run-off basins.
8 And maybe we should have the Flood District make a big
9 treeless basin behind those apartments. Maybe it's like
10 a toilet clog effect. Maybe the water is not flowing as
11 fast as it could, and it's tipping into the streets
12 because it's got to flow out somewhere.

13 And I've been driving by that basin and just
14 looking at it and thinking, you know, maybe it could
15 just flow on out just like a toilet or a bathtub into
16 there. And clean up that basin and make some
17 cut-throughs, and make it one huge drainage basin there.
18 I'm talking about downstream solutions, but I know there
19 are some upstream ones as well. Thank you.

20 SIMON HUGHES

21 Hi. I'm Simon Hughes. 15409 Lakeview.
22 These guys speaking this evening, after hearing from
23 Fred and Ken and Mike and Mike, and the other gentleman
24 who spoke, the engineering firm has a good idea that the
25 citizens here understand what's going on and had a

1 chance to observe. Unfortunately, although this was
2 presented to be a town hall meeting, what we're getting
3 is the same thing that we have in a City Council
4 meeting, which I understand there's an order to it. And
5 that is, okay. You have three minutes to speak, you can
6 say what you say, nobody is going to respond, nobody is
7 going to answer.

8 Ultimately, for the benefit of the citizens, for
9 the benefit of Dannebaum to understand and appreciate
10 the depth and scope of this problem there needs to be a
11 mechanism by which people can have an interaction with
12 you. I understand it's early in the process. You
13 haven't gathered enough evidence, but ultimately y'all
14 are going to need to have one-on-one interactions in
15 this environment or with some of the groups who have
16 demonstrated that they're committed to looking at the
17 problem, understanding the problem. That's the only way
18 you're going to fully understand it.

19 Completing a survey, sending an e-mail saying I
20 see this and this and this, it's not enough. I'm asking
21 you, Dannebaum, in the course of spending the taxpayers
22 money that City Council is paying out to your three
23 firms under this consulting agreement, that you make the
24 conservative effort outside of these town hall meetings
25 or through any other mechanisms, to contact the

1 residents, to talk to the residents one on one but in an
2 interactive fashion so you can understand what everybody
3 have seen, what they've experienced so you can
4 understand and appreciate the depth of the problem so
5 you are able to come up with a viable solution. Thank
6 you.

7 LES VICAIN

8 My name is Les Vicain. I reside at 16102 Capri
9 Drive in Jersey Village. We've been a resident of The
10 Village since 1982. And we've seen floods in the '80s
11 and up until -- the church was built there at Senate and
12 Wall. Our street never had any flooding issues. And I
13 recognize I have a little myopic view, but when the
14 church was built, it backs up to the cul-de-sac on Capri
15 Drive. There was no drainage put in on our cul-de-sac.
16 Consequently, the church parking lot resides at about 24
17 inches above the street level on Capri. So what do you
18 get? You get a bathtub effect when there's a big rain.

19 So I want to make sure that the folks that do
20 their analysis look at drainage situations that are on
21 Capri Drive that backs up to the church parking lot.
22 Thank you.

23 C.J. HARPER

24 Good evening. My name is C.J. Harper. I live at
25 (inaudible). I'm honored to be on the City Council. My

1 comments will be very brief. (Inaudible) how you're
2 going to pay for it. That's the first thing everybody
3 wants to know because it's one of the most important
4 things. Well, reality is we have to work very hard for
5 that. We're a small spoke in a very large wheel.
6 There's only so much money in Harris County. What's the
7 county commissioner going to do?

8 I spoke to commissioner (inaudible). It's a
9 difficult position because there's hundreds and hundreds
10 and hundreds of homes that are in the very same
11 circumstance that we are in. I didn't have anything in
12 the flood. I had a sheet of plywood that blew out
13 during Ike. And it rained on inside my house for a few
14 days. So I understand what water damage can do.

15 The point I want to make to you is that your
16 mayor and council is committed to working strongly with
17 Harris County to get every dollar we can to face the
18 difficult decisions that's going to come acquiring the
19 right-of-way that's going to be necessary in reaching
20 specific decisions that will be adequate to us
21 (inaudible). Thank you again for coming.

22 DEBBIE MAURIELLI

23 My name is Debbie Maurielli. I don't live at 76
24 -- 7806 Hamilton anymore. I don't know when I'm going
25 to get back. That street was hit pretty well. First

1 thing I want to do is also, as some of the other people
2 said, thank you to the public service and the City that
3 watched over our house. They came and got us in a boat
4 and did a really good civic job just watching over our
5 house all this time.

6 I think the biggest thing I've noticed -- and
7 I've only been here nine years, but I have a flood gauge
8 app on my computer so I can watch it -- is that my
9 mother lives up on Huffmeister, which is where I'm
10 living right now, which also crosses White Oak Bayou.
11 When we left here in Jersey Village there were still
12 water. When I got to Huffmeister, it was dry. And
13 Huffmeister and White Oak Bayou, through there, doesn't
14 flood at all.

15 I moved into Jersey Village from Oak Forest,
16 which is where White Oak goes down to TC Jester. All of
17 that has been widened, concreted, deepened. I was
18 really surprised when I -- I was told when we moved here
19 that they built all the remediation ponds, the flooding
20 hasn't been an issue, and that they were having -- they
21 have plans to concrete (inaudible).

22 This is my first flood. It's a memorable flood,
23 but I certainly hope I don't get run off after that. I
24 love Jersey Village. I love living here. I don't want
25 to sell my house. If they're going for right-of-way,

1 I'm the second one off the bayou on Hamilton Circle.
2 It's one of the houses in the front. As far as my
3 neighbors are concerned, I'd hate to lose them. I don't
4 want anybody to lose their house, but if concreting it
5 and deepening could handle it without tearing down
6 houses, that would be nice. Thank you.

7 LAUREL CALKINS

8 Laurel Calkins. I live at 16001 Wall Street. I
9 think everybody knows my story so far. I did what I
10 encourage all of y'all to do. Write down your
11 experiences with flood water observations, flooding in
12 your home, and things you observe. Send it in. I put
13 mine in writing and put it in their hands tonight. I've
14 also e-mailed it to each member of City Council. Be
15 public. Don't keep this to yourself. I keep hearing
16 the entire citizens begging to take our data. Take our
17 data.

18 The other thing I just want to highlight is
19 several comments made before. Hopefully all these
20 graphics will be put on a website somewhere. I've seen
21 a survey website, but I don't know if there's a data
22 website. Is there a place we can look at these things?
23 We would sure like to see that. Also, I keep seeing the
24 timeline. It just seems to stretch out and stretch out.
25 Six months before we hear back on options? No, take the

1 data that the citizens have on that. Get a jump start.
2 Get three months ahead with our data. Move faster.
3 Your timeline takes us past the spring floods into the
4 next hurricane season.

5 I also would like to echo on what one of the
6 Mikes said about the erosion feature, a dam put in the
7 Wall Street channel. It has altered drainage pattern
8 and made flooding much worse on Wall Street area. We
9 ask that be blown up or thought of at a minimum. We
10 also ask that -- I think it's a wonderful idea that one
11 of the Mikes had about maintaining the channels.

12 I live at the corner by the bridge. We mow our
13 channel all the way down to the water. Everybody get on
14 board. Mow your channel, clean out the drain behind
15 you. If we all get involved. We've got shovels. We
16 can do some of this stuff ourselves. Otherwise, we also
17 need the City to get involved. If you've got a tractor,
18 go run it down the channel. Mow that thing out.

19 We would also like to have some financing
20 options. C.J. is right. We're going to have to pay for
21 this somehow. Please incorporate some fancy options
22 with real price tags on your solutions. Don't just say,
23 okay, here it is, now go beg Harris County Flood Control
24 for it. Give us some lobbying ideas. Help us find
25 pressure points. We go apply the pressure. We need

1 your help. Thank you.

2 GARY HOPKINS

3 My name is Gary Hopkins. I agree with a lot of
4 things they've said. They do a real good analysis
5 except for a couple of things. Basically, if you have a
6 ditch by you flooded and the bottom line was where the
7 water went out and came back -- we had a flowback into
8 the neighbor because it couldn't handle the volume. On
9 Philippine they put a large box in. It drew water out
10 in great volume. It came back because that box was too
11 big and poorly engineered. But the reality of it is, is
12 we have to -- we have to divert -- we can't depend on
13 Harris County. We have to divert this water to our
14 reservoir. It's not doing any good.

15 The poor people on Jersey Drive drowned.
16 Anything on either side of the ditches flooded. It's
17 just that simple. We have to enlarge them, and we have
18 to figure out some way to divert the water; not going
19 out of the neighborhood, but over to our reservoir into
20 a storage area that works. This is stupid. All these
21 other things doesn't work. The ditches are terrible.
22 They should be improved. The right-of-way should be
23 done. All of those things are simple. We've got to
24 handle where the water is flowing in the right
25 direction. Because what happened was when it went out,

1 the volume in (inaudible) -- that was a frightening
2 amount of rain.

3 Anything that's four inches of rain in Houston
4 floods because we have so much cement. We have too many
5 things being take up by cement. So you have an
6 absorption. But the bottom line is if we can divert
7 that water somewhere over to where the golf course is,
8 we would be able to handle this problem instead of
9 sending it out, and it can't go anywhere. It just has
10 to come back.

11 Also, I would redo that box on Philippine because
12 it was way too large. It's sort of like the joke on the
13 bayou. I remember in Houston when they cemented those
14 things in. You know what happens when you cement it in?
15 It gets through that much quicker. What happened was --
16 we've got a real good chance if Harris County keeps
17 working the way they're working, that we're going to
18 flood this whole area because we've got two dams that
19 are completely ineffective, that are in disastrous
20 areas. They were made 40, 50 years ago. So we've got a
21 real problem. We really have to take it upon ourselves
22 to divert the water and not send it out because the
23 Beltway 8 has been a disaster for us because of the
24 drainage being caught because it's got nowhere to go.
25 Thank you.

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PAULA JESSUP

Good evening everyone. I'm Paula for Paula and Pete Jessup. I reside at 16026 Capri Drive. My concern, I think everybody is a lot more intelligent than I am concerning the flow of the water and everything else. My concern is the insurance. One of my neighbors called and asked how much it would cost. I believe it was \$15,000 a year. Now, I don't know about y'all, but I pay about \$6,000 a year. I don't like it. So my question to y'all is how soon can we possibly get out of this flood plain so that we can get on back to a normal insurance plan? Thank you.

TAMMY POWERS

My name is Tammy Powers. I don't live at 7806 Hamilton Circle. I live at my mother-in-law's house right now. I believe that part of the problem is if it didn't happen to you there's not this panic. This "I need to get this fixed right now." I remember my sister was expecting back when I was in high school, and she panicked. She had a child, she left her child to us and went off and had fun. It didn't really have the same meaning until I was pregnant and I had a child. And I was like, oh, wait, I'm looking at this totally differently.

And I believe that part of the problem listening

1 to everyone speak, if it's happened to you, you
2 understand. When you're putting out things on the curb,
3 people going through your things, they don't care if
4 they throw it around or whatever. And if you're on the
5 other side of the fence where it didn't happen to you
6 but you want them to fix it so it doesn't happen to you.
7 I think that's part of the dilemma here.

8 I don't know if you've ever been flooded. But I
9 remember moving to Jersey Village in '93. Took a head
10 women's basketball position at (inaudible) where I
11 coached for eight years. And I used to drive down the
12 street, and I was wondering why all those things were
13 out on the curb, but I just drove to school and went to
14 work, and I didn't really worry about it until I moved
15 to Jersey Village.

16 I knew the house flooded when we bought it. It
17 flooded twice with Ron and his wife and kids. But they
18 did construction on their homes, and they did some work
19 in the community, and we thought we would be okay.
20 Eight years went by, no water in the streets, nothing.
21 And then on the 18th, the flood. Furniture, everything,
22 fixture, albums -- trash.

23 I believe that some of the people here have
24 already mentioned there are some things we can do now
25 instead of waiting until the flood happens again. I

1 think that is going to be our focus. Yes, this is going
2 to be great, but this is down the road. Our homes are
3 being fixed right now and hopefully in a few weeks we
4 can move back in, but I don't want to have to go through
5 this again.

6 If there's something we can do today or this week
7 to make sure that it doesn't happen to us again. That's
8 what I think our focus needs to be. This is wonderful,
9 but to me this is a present under the Christmas tree
10 down the road. I want us to focus on things we can do
11 today to help ourselves. And if that means, hey,
12 instead of having a party on Founder's Day, let's all
13 meet in the bayou and clean it out.

14 NEIL FOREMAN

15 I'm Neil Foreman. I live at 16314 Wall Street.
16 Been there for 29 years. In that time, I've seen
17 300-year storm, and I've watched my neighbors get
18 flooded time and again, and it finally got us on the
19 last flood. And I got to looking around at the
20 situation. And if you look at the end of Wall Street,
21 you could actually see the water pouring down from the
22 golf course, comes across Rio Grande down the street.
23 The street acts like a (inaudible). You get tremendous
24 street flooding and backs up the water into the houses,
25 yards and so on.

1 I would like for you to take a very hard look at
2 the drainage situation that can be done with that golf
3 course. You can use water hazards. You can do a lot of
4 things with it to prevent that water from emptying into
5 the street and into our houses. There are certainly
6 other things, like the tributary bayous on the other
7 side of us that could be corrected. But these things
8 have gotten to the point where the minute we have a
9 storm, the City drags out its barricades and puts it at
10 the end of Wall Street. We're tired of being blockaded
11 in our street. We've got a good start on this. It's
12 time to start moving and getting some of these things
13 taken care of. Thank you.

14 KEITH NEVILS

15 My name is Keith Nevils. I live at St. John
16 Court, which is a half circle off of Loger. We built
17 that house in 2001. We actually -- we were just getting
18 our occupancy permit. I was living with my mom on
19 Jersey Drive. It's the house where she was, Sue Lane is
20 the connector. It spilled over the bank, went up there
21 and just put a lot of water into the house. And this
22 was at a point where I got my kids, and we're looking at
23 the outlets. It's about to go above the outlets. What
24 do you do? Find the breaker panel? Very personal
25 experience with me.

1 I live on the bayou. I think one thing that I just --
2 listening, first flood, lived here 12 years. I do watch
3 the bayou almost on a daily basis, especially when it
4 rains because it's out my front door. I think this
5 flood, my first flood, what I realized is the flood --
6 the banks, although they came over, did not come in my
7 front door. The water did not come in my front door; it
8 came in my backdoor. It came in from the back from
9 Jersey.

10 So when we talk about it coming in the front door
11 or coming in my house -- I was up at 2:30 in the
12 morning, 3:30 in the morning, 4:30 in the morning. I
13 watched it. Sit there at 4:30. Went to my backdoor and
14 it was already coming in my house, already in my garage.
15 Three inches. Already -- at least to my knees in my
16 backyard. You could say it's my drainage in my
17 backyard. Funny, it's never had a problem draining in
18 my backyard in 12 years I've lived there though, so I
19 don't understand.

20 But it sounds like people on Jersey got 12 to 15
21 inches. I got 4, maybe 6, but I live on the bayou.
22 When you look at this map, maybe on those purple homes
23 that got flooded, write how many inches everybody got in
24 their house. Maybe it will help make sense. Because if
25 you write six on mine but the house behind me got 12 --

1 I don't know if it went around my house and flooded
2 theirs worse. I don't think that's what happened.

3 I think that my nextdoor neighbor said he got
4 nothing, maybe an inch in the front of his garage, but
5 he's purple on there. So then it looks like maybe
6 another home got flooded and he didn't get flooded. I
7 hope that we -- you talk to us because I think that I
8 live on the bayou. I will say it came up and over the
9 banks, but it did not come in my front door. And I
10 think that's important when you're talking about flood.

11 KEVIN ELLIOT

12 My name is Kevin Elliot. I live at 1615 Capri
13 Drive. I am fortunate that in 31 years I have not
14 flooded. We've only were involved in a vandalism act
15 when my home was built. Some kids ran through the
16 foundation, so the builder came back and laid another
17 foot and a half on top of it. I needed every single
18 inch of it for Allison. But I'm really here
19 representing our street.

20 Les spoke already. And I think our problem is
21 certainly with massive floods, like Allison. The bayou
22 and the bowl effect Les talked about. On Capri, our
23 issue is rain. Our street floods to the point where you
24 can't drive down it at least seven or eight times a
25 year. And we have two drains on the street, and they

1 are eight or nine houses away from the end of the
2 cul-de-sac. It was mentioned above the church being 20
3 inches higher. So that water has to travel two-thirds
4 of the way up our street before it hits a drain. And as
5 a result of that -- and I have pictures. I just sent
6 them to the Flood District -- my backyard, dry; my
7 driveway, water up to the garage, and the front door had
8 two feet. So it is coming from our street before it
9 ever comes from the bayou, and that is something the
10 City can fix. That's something that needs to be done.
11 (Inaudible) It sounds like the prior speaker.

12 Wall Street has the same issue. So that
13 particular area has got to have better drainage. It may
14 end up going to the bayou that's already overflowing,
15 but right now we can't even go up and down the street,
16 too many times to count, and that's something that needs
17 to be repaired. Thank you.

18 ANDREA MACEJAK

19 My name is Andrea Macejak. I'm at 16101 Wall
20 Street. I've talked before, and what I want to really
21 share is my parents actually live on Congo Lane and
22 Solomon. They're across from the high school. I've
23 lived there on and off my whole life. In fact, I live
24 there now because I'm homeless with my daughter. Their
25 home has never flooded, not once. The home that I

1 purchased in 2015 of July, that home did flood. It
2 flooded three times prior, but I believed that the City
3 would have been responsible and had done everything they
4 needed to do. And so I was -- I believed everything was
5 fine and I purchased my home in good faith. So what I
6 actually want to address is this is really a safety
7 issue. I know we're all worried about money. I know
8 we're nervous. The economy is terrible. I lost my job.
9 I have another job; I'm getting paid almost half.

10 What I want to say is my daughter and I, we're in
11 this flood and we moved upstairs. I had water coming
12 from all sorts of places. In fact, mainly my backyard.
13 I was terrified. I'll be honest. At first, I thought
14 it's not a big deal. The water just started coming in.
15 I saw it at the backdoor. Honestly, my parents never
16 flooded. So I was like we're in Jersey Village, we're
17 going to be okay. Boy, was I naive.

18 So it starts coming into the door. Oh, crap. I
19 start putting these cans. And my daughter and I are
20 trying to save the electronics. I realized at that
21 point -- my kid told me, mom, we've got to go upstairs.
22 And she was right. We were in trouble. We were in the
23 safety issue.

24 My thing is I'd like the City Council and I'd
25 like all the residents here -- I know we're going to

1 lose value in our homes. I've already seen it. My
2 parents have -- all of their children right now live in
3 Jersey Village. They've been smart to keep their
4 grandbabies nearby. I need us to really think about
5 this is a safety issue. We have a lot of elderly who
6 cannot move very quickly. Those people are in danger.
7 So please consider that we actually need to think about
8 our safety and our well-being, and not just the dollar
9 signs. And, guys, I'll probably have to sell my house.
10 Think long term, please. This is my home and I don't
11 even live there. And I love Jersey Village. I love it
12 so much I moved back. So please consider that.

13 ADRIAN PETERSON

14 My name is Adrian Peterson. I don't play
15 football. But I've been here in Jersey Village for 38
16 years, and some of the comments I hear tonight, with my
17 engineering background, says that they're pretty -- what
18 we've got in our storm drainage is pretty (inaudible).
19 Nothing flows into the bayou when it gets about half or
20 a third full. I had 14 inches of rain in my rain gauge.
21 I live on Singapore. We never flooded.

22 Well, I had 14 inches in my rain gauge, and, of
23 course, we gave it all down to the east side of Jersey
24 Drive. It all went down there. Not a drop went into
25 the bayou. I went down and rode on that path on my

1 bicycle the next day and, look, the bayou never got
2 three quarters full. But there was not a bit of water
3 going into that. The one question I have is do you
4 guys, in your scope of work, include the isolation of
5 the storm drainage with -- not check valve, but you see
6 some flapper valves on the pipes. (Inaudible). There
7 has to be a way. And 14 inches is a lot of rain. But
8 to move that water from like the lower end of Jersey
9 Drive, put it in the bayou because it wasn't full.

10 The other thing I have is the people that lives
11 here, the earlier residents, they said that Jersey
12 Village had water problems when they put in the Beltway.
13 And does your scope of work include any design activity
14 for doing something about the bypass, the Beltway? If
15 this is your problem, it should be investigated. But
16 there has to be a way.

17 ROD ERSKINE

18 I live at 32 Parkway Place. I heard a lot of
19 good comments today. I know a lot of you will provide
20 your personal observations. Any information like the
21 water came in from the back of my house instead of
22 front, it's incredibly important. I heard a lot of good
23 things tonight. I want to mention a couple of them.

24 Fred Z. had mentioned the golf course. I live on
25 the golf course. When it rains heavy, there's a lot of

1 water coming there. I know it runs off the end. I play
2 on that course a lot, and there's a lot the City can do
3 that's within our control and our budget to help that
4 golf course retain more water and make it flow.

5 Michael Brown mentioned the issue about concrete.
6 When I was on City Council we fought with the Tx.Dot a
7 lot about sound abatement. Today I'm more worried about
8 the huge increase in the square footage of concrete that
9 we're going to see on 290 when it's completed. Where is
10 all that water going to go? I'm looking forward to two
11 years from now how that freeway is going to look outside
12 Jersey Village.

13 The last thing I want to mention is something
14 that I haven't heard, and that is Fred talked about how
15 we're part of a big system of a bayou system. Over the
16 past decades there's been a lot of work done around the
17 three Jersey Village by the Flood Control District. As
18 a taxpayer, I'm assuming that work was not ad hoc.
19 There was a plan and intended an outcome. I don't think
20 what happened on Tax Day was an intended outcome. I
21 hope that your firm will look at that plan, what the
22 intended outcome was, put in the work, and what can be
23 fixed or improved. I think that's very important.

24 I'm glad to hear you're going to do elevation
25 studies. A few years ago there's a big news report

1 about how Jersey Village was sinking. The city manager
2 went down to the University of Houston and talked to the
3 source of that information. Very little (inaudible)
4 were made at that time -- no detail elevation study.
5 I'm glad you're doing this. Thank you.

6 DENISE REANEAU

7 Hi. I'm Denise Reaneau. 19322 Lee Lane. We've
8 been here 29 years, and we've seen flooding. We did
9 flood in Allison. We were within an inch of our -- or
10 less coming in on Tax Day Flood. I don't have a lot of
11 knowledge like these other people have said, but what I
12 do know is just the common thoughts. I believe it's my
13 understanding that the park at Post Elementary, the land
14 owned by the City and not by the school district, as
15 well as the land that's behind the sewer system and then
16 the street next to the day care, that's just all land.
17 And it could be utilized still for soccer practice,
18 still for baseball practice. If we would use it as a
19 detention pond, it would be a very quick fix for that
20 part of where I see, you know, it's backing up.

21 One of the things we were asked to do is step out
22 and see what's going on. Well, believe me, I'm the
23 first person to run out the door. I ran down the street
24 on this flood and tried to speak to a neighbor if we
25 could move our cars, because we're the last house on our

1 side that will flood, or has so far. And by the time I
2 got to his house, got permission and got back, we
3 were -- there was no way. I was in water coming on up.
4 So I can't -- it's very hard to go in an assess in the
5 dark as it was stated earlier. I don't have a drone.
6 That's one of the things that's bothered me. I wanted
7 to bring that out. I thought it would come out by
8 someone else.

9 Another thing I want to talk about is I have a
10 lot of family that lives in Cypress, and they were
11 surprised by all the flooding that occurred, the first
12 time for them in the Cypress Creek. They're doing this,
13 what we're doing, in a big fashion. And I hope whoever
14 is coordinating us, you guys, but also who else is
15 coordinating from the City is attending some of their
16 meetings because that's concerning that if there's not a
17 collaboration we could have an outcome that doesn't work
18 because they've already done something else.

19 JENNA LIKINS

20 Hi. My name is Jenna. I want to introduce
21 myself and my classmates to you. We are studying at
22 Texas A&M University at College Station specifically
23 what is going on here in Jersey Village, and what this
24 city could potentially do with ongoing management as
25 many of you have mentioned today. So whether that be

1 bayou maintenance, drainage in the streets, whatever the
2 City can implement to preserve whatever project is
3 completed by this firm, by the City. It would be a
4 shame to have a project completed and not maintained and
5 have another crisis occur. So we are here to help you
6 with this problem. We have been in contact with the
7 Flood Group here. We will hang around to hear you and
8 for more contact information. Thank you.

9 GEORGE McLURE

10 George McClure. It's become really clear to me
11 tonight listening to this that there are multiple
12 problems that are causing the flood. I'm an engineer.
13 I've been in the electrical but not civil, but I've done
14 studies before. In doing studies what you really want
15 to do is: Here's the problem, now we have the problem,
16 we can find the solution.

17 I urge Dannebaum not to try to find the problem
18 because I can hear the very same problems. The problems
19 we've got on Wall Street, in that area, are totally
20 different than what we have in other areas. The causes
21 of the flood is different. Our system cannot handle the
22 volume of the water. It has to flow through the Village
23 and out. In some places the issue is street flooding
24 where the street -- you don't want the bayou come out of
25 the banks because it will flood your home. In other

1 areas, where I live, the water comes down our street and
2 flows into the bayou, into the drainage system. So
3 there is not an issue of water coming over the bayou
4 because the bayou and the streets connect. Even if you
5 have a check valve, it's going to run from the City.

6 Let me tell you a story. I saw this in Allison.
7 We saw this on Tax Day. At the pique of the flood, you
8 can see a little bit of the bayou -- the banks above the
9 bayou was (inaudible). I was able to stand. If it
10 wasn't for where I was standing, the water from
11 Philippine was not flowing down the street anymore, all
12 the way across the bayou, all the way across the other
13 side into the back of the homes on Jersey Drive. It was
14 like a lake. However, it was flowing at about 20 miles
15 an hour like a stream. It kind of takes your breath
16 away.

17 I want to urge everyone not to get too hung up on
18 -- detention ponds, of course every little bit helps.
19 If you can see that volume of water that's moving down
20 White Oak Bayou and it crosses from Philippine over to
21 Jersey. I mean, there's detention ponds you can build
22 in seconds. It's deceptive to think just build
23 detention ponds here, detention ponds there, it will
24 hold up the water. It won't hold up the water. Thank
25 you.

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CARL JACKSITS

Hello. I'm Carl Jacksits. 16209 Wall Street. I've spoken a number of times to City Council in the past six months about a lot of the issues brought up tonight. Most of the things are pretty well covered. One of the things I would like studied or include would be looking at cross-sectional areas of the bayou; that the three that cross the bayou, Senate, Lakeview and I guess it's Tahoe. Compare them to the (inaudible). It also -- the cross-sectional area of what's left, it let's water flow out (inaudible) because I've been here eleven years.

During Ike -- we were not here during Ike. The bayou came up high on Wall. It came up pretty high. It came up maybe three or four feet high. We had a lot of water from Ike. Maybe it wasn't the same type of rain. But I think the cross-sectional areas need to be addressed again, and we also need to look at the bridges above -- or how it (inaudible) the flow of water. Also, look below. Just walking around if you look down below you'll see one of the storm outlets, which is pretty far up into the bayou. Basically blocks the flow. We've got to look at these kind of things. Thank you.

CHIRONNE DESMOND

1 County Tollroad bridges 8 inches. So all the work that
2 they've done has only decreased the level by 8 inches.

3 And so, you know, we have three areas of where
4 water is coming into the city. We've got the main
5 channel, and we've got two tributaries or conveyance
6 channels that are coming from the south side of 290.
7 And, you know what's going on is all of this water
8 coming down the main channel and through these
9 tributaries is all converging right to the south of
10 north Tahoe Bridge. So all of that water is coming into
11 that area, and it's trying to get out through the bridge
12 of Harris County Tollroad and the Tx.Dot feeder road.

13 Now, they talk about the bends and the bayous,
14 which slow the amount of water, how it travels, the
15 velocity of the water traveling. And they're talking
16 about wanting to straighten those, which I think is
17 beneficial. They're talking about deepening them.
18 They're talking about widening them. And that is
19 beneficial. It's going to add increased area for that
20 water to be in the bayou or in the conveyance channels
21 instead of outside of them trying to flood our homes.

22 And so, anyway, even if we do all of this work
23 and add the increased amount of area that we can retain
24 water inside the City of Jersey Village, if the bridges
25 at Philippine, just to the south Philippine, and the

1 bridge at the bypass channel are not enlarged, the water
2 is not going to get out of the City of Jersey Village.

3 So, anyway, I'm just basically -- like I said,
4 I've looked at the problem and with the development
5 that's going to happen on the other side of 290. Like
6 people have said, it's going to be a lot more concrete,
7 and that water is going to have to go through the City
8 of Jersey Village. I appreciate you listening to my
9 comments.

10 KATIE FRITSCH

11 Hi. My name Katie Fritsch. I live at 15906
12 Jersey Drive. My family moved into this neighborhood
13 eleven years ago. I know for many of you that's not
14 that long ago, but I brought all three of my babies home
15 to that house. And I think that if you haven't gone
16 through the flood -- I know most of you have -- you
17 don't know, you can't know how hard it is. My mom
18 forgets. Even the other day she says to me, "Don't you
19 have jackets from last year?" No, I don't. I don't
20 have anything for the kids to wear when we go to my
21 mother's next week. I have to buy all of that stuff.

22 The water came in. I live on the corner of
23 Jersey and Elwood. I just want to say -- because Elwood
24 was brought up earlier -- that the water came in from
25 Elwood but the side of Elwood. It came in the side of

1 my house first, and then it came in from Jersey. It
2 didn't come in the back of my house. Elwood, it was
3 lifted pretty considerably, and drainage wasn't put in.
4 I know the old bayou is not (inaudible), so the drainage
5 cannot help. There's no drainage, there's no drain
6 around the curb. I just wanted to point out those
7 things. Thank you for listening.

8 RISA SCHUSTER

9 My name is Risa Schuster. I live at 161 --
10 (inaudible). I'm hearing all of the opinions with the
11 localized flooding to our street something that, again,
12 really the City of Jersey Village and Flood Control lack
13 of drainage. We only have two outlets for the whole
14 street. They're uphill from the center of the street.
15 So we reach a point where no matter how much water comes
16 onto the street, the water stops flowing into those
17 drains. About five years ago the City rebuilt Carlsbad,
18 which is the other end of our street, and they put
19 additional drainage. They put in 8 inlets to the bayou.
20 We have two at the very end at higher points.

21 We have experienced three flooding. Many times
22 every year, since 1998, it's to the point where we don't
23 allow anyone to park on our street overnight. In the
24 week, we had a high amount of rain. Our street flooded
25 within 30 minutes. I left the house, went up to

1 Willowbrook Mall. My husband called me within 30
2 minutes and said, "Get home." Our daughter's car is
3 parked in the street. He had no keys to move it. The
4 water was almost in the car in 30 minutes of rain. And
5 water was over the curbs on that street. It had not
6 rained all day or much that week. So we believe that at
7 least for our street, a lot will be -- could be done
8 just to improve our flooding due to street drainage.

9 The other thing I was going to say is the first
10 flood was back in 2001. We had about ten inches in the
11 house. This time we almost didn't flood. I mean, it
12 was one inch. Just as much damage as before when we had
13 replaced all our flooring, walls, cabinets, everything.
14 Once it gets wet, your mold starts. A little bit of a
15 difference, we would not have been part of this flood.

16 GERILYN STAGGS

17 My name is Gerilyn Staggs. I live at 15622
18 Jersey Drive. I'm not going to talk about Jersey. I'm
19 talking about Seattle. I want to make sure that's
20 addressed. It's in the, quote, non-flooded section of
21 Jersey Village. My parents live there. I grew up
22 there. They moved in there since '76. They did take on
23 water in the flood, and I noticed it's not on the map.
24 It was reported. But it didn't come in the house from
25 the street. It came up through the toilet because of

1 the drains.

2 We evacuated our house. My husband and two dogs
3 at 3:30 in the morning off of Jersey. We went to my
4 parents' house. After we got the dogs in and settled
5 there, I was standing there and I'm like "there's a lot
6 of water here in the utility room." It's coming out of
7 the toilet in the powder room, the bathroom. I spent
8 the next three and a half hours with a shell pack
9 (phonetic), stuck on that toilet, filling that thing up,
10 taking it out, dumping it. They still had three inches
11 of water in their utility room, into the kitchen.

12 If we hadn't come when we did, they would have
13 slept through it all and woken up to three, four, six
14 inches of toilet sewer water in their house. It was
15 reported at the time to city hall. Nobody from city
16 hall called them back to talk about it. My mom has
17 called one other time about it. But it's a drainage
18 problem. I know the people at the corner of Seattle and
19 Carlsbad have posted pictures on the neighborhood about
20 the section and their flooding. It did come up over the
21 curb at the Seattle/Senate intersection. They're on the
22 intersection of -- it's just been getting worst the last
23 two years.

24 So drainage problem is not as bad as Capri, but
25 it is an underground; not related to bayou-existing

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1 issue problems. So speaking for Seattle. Thank you.
