Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Next month we celebrate our city's 68<sup>th</sup> birthday with our annual Founder's Day event at Clark Henry Park! Founder's Day will be held on Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup> from 4:30pm until 9:30pm, so make plans now to attend. As in prior years, most of the activities will be free to everyone, but there will be some additional activities such as inflatables and amusement rides available to those who have purchased wristbands for the event. I continue to hear from residents who are very excited about the new golf course clubhouse nearing completion. While we have not yet set a date for the grand opening of the new clubhouse, we're currently on track to open sometime in April. Keep an eye out for an announcement in the coming weeks!

I am happy to announce that the previously announced app to allow residents to track their water consumption in real-time has been launched. Neptune My360 will allow residents to set usage alerts and water budgets to better understand how their water consumption may impact their upcoming water bill. There is a link on the city website with instructions on how to sign up for this free app and use it to keep tabs on your home's water consumption. With warmer weather around the corner, I encourage everyone to take advantage of this very useful tool.

Finally, while our city staff continues to work on revising the water and sewer rates to address some of the concerns residents expressed regarding the current rate structures, city council took steps to reduce the potential financial impact on homes without a second meter for irrigation. Wastewater charges for residential customers will now be capped at 12,000 gallons of wastewater usage, regardless of the amount of water consumed. While single meters residents will still see higher bills compared to comparable high consumption dual meter residents, this will help to close the gap somewhat until the new rate structure is ready.
