Over the next 6 years the phone and email have reduced to a trickle. I also am starting to receive a lot more 'thank you' calls than reports of something broken. That was really a surprise and I appreciate those calls. That is how I know the city is working well for you.

We are very blessed to live in Jersey Village and in this region of the United States. The economy continues to grow and new development and jobs are added daily. Where I once thought Jersey Village was the last neighborhood heading out of Houston, now I see uncounted houses, schools and shopping centers to the Grand Parkway and beyond.

Twenty years ago, Vickie and I chose to move here to raise our two daughters. They went to the schools here and participated in scouts, sports and extra-curricular school activities with friends from the neighborhood; we knew both their friends and their parents. They have both completed college and have started successful careers in Denver and Tulsa. The reasons we picked Jersey Village as home -- great schools, a close–knit community, the best fire and police service in the state, a golf course within walking distance -- still exist and I think our city will entice new residents who appreciate the accessibility for work commutes.
