MAYOR'S LETTER DECEMBER 2011

READY OR NOT HERE IT COMES

One of the only complaints I have about living in Jersey Village is that the shortest way to my office in Greenway Plaza is via Highway 29

0. Unfortunately, that is not always the quickest way. When I moved my family here in 1992, 290 was the best freeway in town; in the last few years, it has become the worst freeway in town. I have heard about 290 traffic relief in many different forms: Hempstead Toll Road, 290 expansion, Hempstead upgrades, commuter rail, expanded Park & Rides. While all of those ideas would be helpful, none of them had any immediate funding. The total package was estimated at \$4.6 Billion. The vision as stated in the website http://my290.com is:

- Freeway capacity reconstruction and widening from IH 610 to FM 2920 to create:
- Five general-purpose lanes in each direction from IH 610 to just west of Beltway 8, plus auxiliary lanes where appropriate
- Four general-purpose lanes in each direction from just west of Beltway 8 to near the proposed SH 99/Grand Parkway, plus auxiliary lanes
- Three general-purpose lanes in each direction from near the proposed SH 99/Grand Parkway to the west study limit, plus auxiliary lanes
- Two- or three-lane frontage roads in each direction throughout the corridor
- A four-lane, two-way managed lanes facility along Hempstead Tollway from IH 610 to the proposed SH 99/Grand Parkway
- Two general-purpose lanes (possibly three) with curb and gutter in each direction to be reconstructed along Hempstead Highway from IH 610 to Beltway 8
- US 290 METRO HOV operations moved to the Hempstead managed lanes
- Proposed high-capacity transit corridor located along Hempstead Tollway
- Bicycle and pedestrian improvements

Finally funding is happening and work on the project was started at the 290/610 interchange. I was under the impression that the project would start at the east end and progress west. That schedule would have construction in Jersey Village several years from now. We were recently informed, however, that the next phase of the 290 construction will be in Jersey Village and it will be happening very quickly. All of a sudden, there is a lot of work to do.

The eventual completed project will be great for Jersey Village. However, as we all know construction is dirty and messy. The expanded freeway will impact the city in many negative ways: increased noise pollution, increased drainage problems, loss of revenue of condemned properties and loss of retail outlets along the right of way.

I have initiated discussions with several Memorial Village mayors who experienced similar issues along the Katy Freeway in recent years. I have scheduled meetings with Congressman John Culberson and TxDOT, and will discuss the construction with other influential state representatives and our State Senator, Dan Patrick.

City Council has made preparations to protect the city's interest, to protect our properties and to minimize the negative impact of the highway expansion.

The most powerful voice in all governmental decisions, however, is the voice of the citizens. This was demonstrated when a large group of Jersey Village residents led by Mark Maloy persuaded the Harris

County Toll Road Authority to resurface the toll road with sound reducing asphalt. I encourage you to find out about the 290 construction and get involved to maximize the benefits of this project and minimize the problems encountered along the way.

I will keep you informed as we move along during construction.
