

City Seeking to FIII Council Vacancy

At the November 18, 2013 Regular Meeting of the Jersey Village City Council, Resolution 2013-78 was passed, accepting the resignation of Council Member Sandra Joachim, and declaring a vacancy of city Council Member Place 2. City Council is now seeking to fill this position for a term that will expire in May, 2014. Qualifications required to hold office may be reviewed at Section 2.02 of the City Charter. The City Charter may be accessed online through the Jersey Village web site (www.jerseyvillage.info). Prospective officeholders should complete the Application for City Boards, Commissions, and Committees that is available under the City Secretary page of the Jersey Village web site. Please write "City Council" under the Comments Section of the

application. Completed forms should be received at city hall, or e-mailed to the office of the city secretary no later than 5:00 PM, January 15, 2014. Incomplete applications and applications received after this deadline will not be forwarded to city council. City Council has requested that prospective candidates be prepared to deliver a three to five minute presentation at the beginning of the January 20 city council meeting. Candidates should be prepared to present their qualifications for office, in addition to providing an explanation of why they desire to hold office.

How to Prevent Identity Theft

If a thief takes your personal information and uses it for financial gain, you have been a victim of identity theft. Criminals can use your personal information to reroute your mail, open bank accounts in your name, and fraudulently apply for loans and credit. You may not know somebody has been using your identity until it's too late. Bank statements, bills, receipts, photos, pre-approved credit card mail, junk mail with your personal address, jotted down phone numbers, warranty cards — you'll be amazed how many pieces of paper have your personal information on it. And once it's thrown out, it's fair game.

•Invest in a **cross cut shredder** (it shreds paper both ways)

- •Shred all old bills, bank statements, credit cards, personal notes, anything that has your personal information or address on it.
- •Retrieve all your mail promptly. Track your regular mail, such as bills, bank statements and magazine subscriptions. If they suddenly stop, somebody may have changed your address.
- •If you've purchased a high-ticket item, such as a computer or big screen TV, disguise the box you throw out by breaking it down and placing it in a bag. That way dumpster divers won't tag you as having a high income.
- •Review all your bank and credit card statements for suspicious purchases and activity
- Move your bills and bank statements online, so there is less paper with your identity printed on it
- •Protect your computer with specialized identity theft software ★



Outstanding Contribution Award to Dr. Diana Fite

The American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) presented the James D. Mills Outstanding Contribution award to Dr. Diana Fite. She is an attending physician at two hospital emergency departments in Houston; Methodist Willowbrook and Christus Saint Catherine's. In addition, two free standing emergency facilities in Katy and Tomball. Dr. Fite pursued Obstetrics and Gynecology while pursuing emergency medicine. also has served in many leadership positions in organized medicine, being the first emergency physician to serve as president of the Harris County Medical Society in 1995. It is the largest county medical society in the nation, with more than 12,000 members. In the early 1980s, Dr. Fite recognized that a significant number of emergency patients were unrecognized as victims of child abuse

and domestic violence. She became the first physician member of the Houston Area Women's Center board of directors. Dr. Fite gave many lectures throughout Texas educating physicians on the subject in the years before awareness became widespread. Dr. Fite served 22 years as a part time clinical assistant professor for the emergency medicine residency program at University of Texas Medical School. She also served 22 years on the Legislative Chair for The Texas College of Emergency Physicians.

Since 1985, Dr. Fite continues to serve the citizens of Jersey Village in a non-paid role as the Medical Director establishing protocol for our EMS Department. Dr. Fite lives in Tomball and is a proud mother of eight children. Jersey Village Fire Department Staff and members are proud of Doctor Fite and all of her accomplishments!

Don't Forget to Register Your Dog or Cat

This is a reminder that the City of Jersey Village requires all dogs or cats to have the animal vaccination against rabies by the time the animal is four months of age and at regular intervals thereafter as prescribed by board rule. Be sure to bring your pet's rabies vaccination certificate. Every person owning, keeping or having in possession any dog or cat shall pay an annual license fee and receive a pet tag which

shall be effective for a period of one year from the date of issuance.

Pet tags can be purchased at City Hall, located at 16327 Lakeview Drive, for \$5.00 Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

A Guide to the Suspicious

No police department can function without the concerned assistance of responsible citizens. The Police are depending on YOU to call and tell them whenever you observe suspicious persons or actions.

Information Most Often Needed by Police

- What Happened?
- When?
- Where?
- Anyone Injured?
- Vehicle Tag
- Vehicle Description
- Direction of Travel
- **Description of Persons** (including clothing and/or how many) When describing suspects, notice age, race, sex, height, and weight.

WHAT IS SUSPICIOUS?

Basically, anything that seems even slightly "out of place" or that is occurring at an unusual time of day could be criminal activity. Some of the most obvious things to watch for:

- A stranger entering your neighbor's house when it's unoccupied.
- A scream heard anywhere might mean a robbery or assault.
- Any removing of accessories, license plates or gasoline from a car should be reported.
- Persons entering or leaving a business place after hours.
- Anyone peering into parked cars may be looking for a car to steal, or for valuables left displayed in the car.
- The sound of breaking glass or loud explosive noises could mean an accident, burglary, or vandalism.

 Persons loitering around the neighborhood who do not live there could be burglars looking for a target.

While some, if not all of the suspicious situations described could have innocent explanations, your police department would rather investigate a crime-prone situation than be called when it is too late. YOUR CALL COULD SAVE A LIFE, PREVENT AN INJURY OR STOP A CRIMINAL ACT.

Do you have a Generator for your home?

When fire fighters respond to a home or business on fire one of the first tasks we do is turn off the electricity to that building. We do this because water and electricity do not mix together well and we do not want our fire fighters getting electrocuted when battling the fire with water.

If you have installed a generator on your property, when we turn off the electricity most likely that generator will turn on and our efforts to reduce the risk of injury to our fire fighters was for nothing. Sometimes we see the generator on location and sometimes we don't. In an effort to be proactive and make sure our fire fighters realize a home has a generator we would like to install a generator sticker on your electrical panel box. This will give our fire fighters an extra sense of security knowing they need to shut the generator off in addition to the regular electricity when making an emergency at your home.

CITY TO ELECT FOUR COUNCIL MEMBERS IN MAY, 2014

In any given election year, City residents typically go to the polls to elect three Councilmembers to serve on City Council. According to the City's Charter, the Places up for election alternate with Places 1, 4, and 5 being up for election in even numbered years and the Mayor and Places 2 and 3 up for election in odd numbered years.

During 2013, Sandra Joachim, Councilmember Place 2, resigned from office. While City Council has filled the vacancy temporarily in accordance with Charter requirements, it is necessary that a Special Election be conducted in May 2014 for the purpose of electing a councilmember to Place 2 for the unexpired term which will end in May 2015.

Accordingly, on January 20, 2014, City Council

passed Ordinances calling a General Election and a Special Election, making 2014 a very important election year for the City. This article will provide some insight on what residents can expect.

First, the City's General Election will be held on May 10, 2014 to elect a Councilmember for Place 1, a Councilmember for Place 4, and a Councilmember for Place 5. The timeframe in which to file for a place on the ballot for anyone of these Places is January 29 through February 28, 2014 at 5:00 p.m. Interested candidates should contact the City Secretary for a Candidate Packet.

Second, the City will conduct a Special Election on May 10, 2014 for the purpose of electing a Councilmember to Place 2

for the unexpired term which ends in May 2015. The timeframe in which to file for a place on the ballot for anyone interest in this place is January 21 through March 10, 2014 at 5:00 p.m. Interested candidates should contact the City Secretary for a Candidate Packet.

While all Places on the ballot will be for a place on City Council, there will be two elections, a General Election for Places 1, 4, and 5 and a Special Election for Place 2. Because the election law is different for General Elections versus Special Elections, the filing deadlines are different. LA CIUDAD NECESITA ELEGIR CUATRO MIEMBROS DEL CONCEJO MUNICIPAL EN MAYO 2014

En cualquier año de elecciones, los residentes de la ciudad típicamente van a las urnas a elegir tres miembros para servir en el concejo municipal. De acuerdo a los estatutos de la ciudad, las posiciones a elegir se alternan de la siguiente forma. Posiciones 1, 4 y 5 se eligen en los años con números pares y las posiciones del alcalde, 2 y 3 en los años con números impares.

Durante el año 2013, Sandra Joachim, concejal en la posición número 2 renuncio a su cargo. Aunque el concejo de la ciudad ha llenado la posición temporariamente de acuerdo a los requerimientos de los estatutos de la ciudad, será necesario conducir unas elecciones especiales en el mes de Mayo 2014 con el propósito de elegir un miembro del concejo para la posición 2 por el resto del término que terminara en Mayo 2015. Como corresponde, el 20 de enero del 2014, el concejo municipal aprobó una ordenanza llamando a una elección general y a una elección especial, por consiguiente el año 2014 será un año de elecciones importante

para la ciudad. Este artículo proveerá una visión sobre que pueden esperar los residentes.

Primeramente, la elección general de la ciudad se llevara a cabo el 10 de mayo del 2014 para elegir un miembro del concejo municipal para la posición 1, un miembro del concejo municipal para la posición 4 y un miembro del concejo municipal para la posición 5. El margen de tiempo para aplicar para una posición en la boleta para cualquiera de estos lugares es desde el 29 de enero hasta el 28 de febrero del 2014 a las 5:00 P.M. Los candidatos interesados deben contactar a la secretaria de la ciudad para recoger sus paquetes para candidatos.

Segundo punto, la ciudad llevara a cabo una elección especial el 10 de mayo del 2014, con el propósito de elegir un miembro del concejo municipal para la posición 2 para completar el término de esta posición que termina en mayo del

2015. El margen de tiempo para aplicar para una posición en la boleta para cualquier persona interesada en esta posición es desde el 21 de enero hasta el 14 de marzo del 2014 a las 5:00 P.M. Los candidatos interesados deben contactar a la secretaria de la ciudad para recoger sus paquetes para candidatos.

Mientras que todos los lugares en la boleta de votación serán por un lugar en concejo municipal de la ciudad, se llevara a cabo dos elecciones, una elección general para las posiciones 1, 4 y 5, y además una elección especial para la posición 2. Debido que las leyes de elecciones son diferentes para unas elecciones generales cuando se compara con elecciones especiales, el tiempo para aplicar es diferente. Last year the 2nd Annual Jersey Village American Legion 5K Fun Run was a huge success. This year the 3rd Annual 5K Fun Run will be held on Saturday, March 29, 2014 at 8:30am at Clark Henry Park. Information on this event can be found at: www.jerseyvillageamericanlegion5kfunrun.com

The 5K Fun Run will be the same course as last year: Two loops, starting at Post Elementary and run counter clock-wise around the Jersey Village High School on Congo and Solomon and part of Gulf Bank to Security Way and then

onto the hike and bike trail. There will be a runner's lane on all three streets. The four main intersections that will be closed will be at Jersey Drive and Equador Street, Shanghai Street and Equador Street, Congo Lane and Equador Street, and Congo Lane and Solomon Street. For runners interested in their individual times, timing chips will be provided. There will also be hydration stations set up so the runners will be able to hydrate. At the end of the race there will be fruit and drinks.

People who live in the vicinity will have to be patient as well as cognizant of the runners that morning. If you have nothing planned for the morning of the Fun Run come out and cheer the runner's on. If you have something planned for that morning and you live in the vicinity of the fun run, leave early enough so it will not interfere with your plans.





The City of Jersey Village encourages everyone to participate in the city's recycling program! Here are some simple (but effective) ways you can move your family towards your green home goals.

Keep it simple. If you want your family and especially your children to start recycling, you'll have better success if you make it easy for them. Set your family recycling cans in a high-traffic area, preferably near the garbage can. If you need to separate your recyclables in your area, make sure each can is prominently marked to help your kids. Set clear goals. Understanding recycling and its impact on the environment can

be difficult or small children. Instead, provide them with a tangible goal such as throwing out no more than three bags of trash each week. Keep track of each successful week and treat your family to pizza at the end of a good month. Your kids will work hard towards the goal and you'll make their at home recycling a pleasurable experience.

Work with them to conserve. Sometimes materials can be recycled without ever going into the recycling bin. Work to teach your kids not to be wasteful with the materials they already use. Teach them to draw on both sides of their paper or write on both sides in their notebook. Instead of providing them with a new cup each time they want a drink, encourage them to use the same cup throughout the day. You can also set a positive example by taking clothing or toys your children have outgrown and donate them to a local charity rather than simply throw them away. **

In recent days, we have received a gift from Sparkle Sign to display this artifact. Vice President John Blue of Sparkle Sign spent more than 200 hours of his time to create and build a remarkable work of art to display this treasured item. All of the material and labor were donated by Sparkle Sign because they wanted to do something for Jersey Village because Jersey Village is their home.

I want to invite you to our fire station to see this incredible work of art! Pictures do not give this work of art the gratification it so deserves! Please stop by when you have the time. Even if you cannot get here during normal business hours, the view from the front doors with it all lit up at night is

Important Voting Changes Photo ID's Required To Vote

A new law has gone into effect that will change how voters votes in Texas. In the past, a voter only needed to present his/her valid voter registration certificate to the voting clerk and eligibility to vote was confirmed. This will no longer be the practice as the new law requires that all voters must produce one of the following forms of photo identification in order to be eligible to vote in Texas elections:

- Driver's license, election identification certificate, personal identification card, or concealed handgun license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety;
- United States Military identification card that contains the person's photograph;
- United States citizenship certificate that contains the person's photograph;
- United States passport.

All forms of identification listed, excepting US citizenship certificates, must be current or have been expired no more than 60 days before it is presented for voter qualification at the polling place.

The election identification certificate is a new form of photo identification created by this new law. These identification certificates are being issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety to registered voters or those eligible to register who do not have the required form of photo identification. There is no fee for the certificate.

The Fire Department brought out the Life flight helicopter, plus had several scenarios that showed what it took to put out a fire. If you have never been to the police station or the fire department this is a great day to visit.



Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR)

The Comprehensive Annual Financial Report of the City of Jersey Village for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2013 was submitted after an extensive and meticulous audit by our external auditors.

Our auditors, Belt Harris Pechacek, LLP has issued an unqualified ("clean") opinion on the City's financial statements for the year ended September 30, 2013. The independent auditor's report is located at the front of the financial section of this report. Management's discussion and analysis (MD&A) immediately follows the independent auditors' report and provides a narrative introduction, overview and analysis of the basic financial statements.

The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) awarded a "Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting" to the City of Jersey Village for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2012. This was the fifteenth consecutive year that the City has achieved this prestigious award. In order to be awarded a Certificate of Achievement, a government must publish an easily readable and efficiently organized CAFR. This report must satisfy both generally accepted accounting principles and applicable legal requirements. We believe that our current CAFR continues to meet the Certificate of Achievement Program's requirements and we submitted it to the GFOA in order to determine its eligibility for another certificate.

What Number Should I Call? 911 or 713-466-5824

(Non-Emergency Phone Number for Jersey Village)

Calling 911 is the primary phone number to call when you have an emergency. Whether you are using your home phone or cellular phone this should be your primary method to ask for help and get an Ambulance, Fire Truck or Police Car. The city encourages residents to use the 911 system for emergencies especially from your home phone because the 911 system recognizes your address and phone number and maps the location through a sophisticated system. With the use of cellular devices, there has been a great deal of advances with the 911 system. The main downfall is the cell phone signal goes to the closest cell tower and uses that cell phone tower address as the location of the call. There will eventually be further advances to identify the cell phones exact location, but we are not quite there yet. Please understand that 911 is the way to go if you have an emergency. 911 is a guaranteed answer from a 911 operator whether the communications operator is in Jersey Village or at Harris County 911

The 713-466-5824 phone number is the cities non-emergency recorded phone line. It goes directly to the cities 911 Communications Operators dispatch office. The communications operators are ready to answer your call, but when using the 713-466-5824 there could be a delay if the 911 operator is taking another 911 phone call or is in the middle of radio traffic with either the police or fire personnel. If they are busy what might happen is the 911 operator answers the phone and request you to hold while they deal with what is considered a more emergent phone call or radio traffic. We are not saying a call to the nonemergency phone number is not important, but the priority in our communications dispatch center will be the 911 phone line and the Police and Fire personnel's radio traffic.

As you can see you have some choices when trying to get help or have a concern handled. If you're not quite sure you have an emergency situation call the 713-466-5824. Our Communications Operators are ready to answer your call.

- When calling 9-1-1, one of the first things you'll be asked to provide is the location of the emergency you're reporting.
- Tell the call taker the location of the emergency. Provide landmarks such as cross streets.
- Always be aware of your surroundings.
- It is appropriate to call 9-1-1 when you need to save a life, stop a crime or report a fire.
- Try to stay calm, listen carefully, give information and follow all instructions.

- In an emergency, seconds matter, so being knowledgeable and prepared can make all the difference.
- Knowing when to call and what to expect when you phone 9-1-1 can help reduce fear and feelings of helplessness in an emergency.
- The more you know what to expect when you call 9-1-1, the faster 9-1-1 can get you the help you need.
- If you dial 9-1-1 for a non-emergency matter, you are tying up resources that could be needed in a real emergency.
- You can save a life! Follow all instructions the 9-1-1 call taker gives you, and don't hang up until the call taker does.

Your information will be safe and secure and only is intended to help city officials during your time of need. ★

Road Rage!

Characteristics of Aggressive Driving

- Following too closely
- Driving at excessive speed
- Weaving through traffic
- Running stop lights and signs

Traffic Congestion:

Traffic congestion is one of the most frequently mentioned contributing factors to aggressive driving. Drivers with low tolerances for traffic delays might respond by following too closely, changing lanes frequently, or becoming angry at anyone who impedes their progress.

Running Late:

Some people drive aggressively because they have too much to do and are running late for work, school, their next meeting, lesson, soccer game, or other appointment.

How to Avoid Becoming a Victim of Road Rage:

- 1. Obey posted speed limits and traffic
- 2. Keep to the right if you are a slower driver.
- 3. If you see an individual driving recklessly and have a cell phone, call 911 with a description of the car and the license plate number.
- 4. Be cautious of other drivers and expect the unexpected.
- 5. Do not make eye contact with an irate driver.
- 6. Do not confront an upset motorist.
- 7. If you are cut off, do not make any hand gestures to the other motorist.
- 8. If you are being chased by another motorist who appears to be in a rage, do not weave in and out of traffic.
- 9. If you are being chased, drive with the flow of traffic. If you have a cell phone, call 911.
- 10. If you have to pull over, try to go to a well-lighted location where there are other people. *

June 2014: City of Jersey Village's Building Code **Amendments:**

The City of Jersey Village City Council approved the adoption of recent editions of the model building codes: the 2012 International Codes and the National Electrical Code -- both with local amendments. The City had been regulating construction under the 2006 International Codes and the 2005 National Electrical Code. City Council formally adopted the 2012 International Building Code (IBC), 2012 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), 2012 International Fire Code (IFC), 2012 International Fuel Gas Code (IFGC), 2012 International Mechanical Code (IMC), 2012 International Plumbing Code (IPC), 2012 International Swimming Pool and Spa Code (ISPSC), 2012 International Residential Code (IRC) and 2011 National Electrical Code (NEC) with the minimal local amendments as established and recommended by staff and the Building Board of Adjustment and Appeals.

The City also adopted important modifications to existing local amendments specific to Jersey Village, but also related to our participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). One change that will benefit all local residents is a modification to what's referred to as "the 50-percent rule." The new amendments no longer require that projects exceeding 50 percent of a structure's valuation necessitate the balance of the structure being brought into building code compliance. Only those structures which are in the regulatory floodplain, with proposed repairs and/or renovations exceeding 50 percent of the then physical value of the building, need comply with all requirements in regards to slab height and associated new Mechanical, Electrical, Fuel Gas & Plumbing Equipment & Fixtures. All additions, whether in the floodplain or outside, must comply with regards to slab height (and associated equipment & fixtures where located within the regulatory floodplain). If you have any questions regarding the new code adoption, please contact the Community Development Department. *



City Announces Openings on Board of Adjustment

The Jersey Village City Council is accepting applications to fill openings on the Board of Adjustment. Qualified applicants must be residents of the City of Jersey Village. Responsibilities for Board of Adjustment members are as follows:

- (1) The board is authorized to hear and decide appeals where it is alleged that there is an error in an order or decision by the municipal enforcement officials in applying the standards of articles IV, V, X, XI and XII of Chapter 14 of the Jersey Village Code of Ordinances (see Section 14-10), the same being those articles adopted under V.T.C.A., Local Government Code ch. 211.
- (2) The board is authorized to hear and decide special exceptions to the terms of this chapter where such special exceptions are allowed by this chapter and authorize in specific cases a variance from the terms of Chapter 14 as established in Section 14-10. (See also V.T.C.A., Local Government Code § 211.009).

The City Council invites interested Jersey Village citizens who wish to serve on the Board of Adjustment to complete an application. The Council will review all applications during its July 21st Regular Council Meeting and appoint applicants in compliance with the terms of the Charter. Citizens are encouraged to complete applications and submit them to the City Secretary as soon as possible.

- Know your neighbors. Exchange phone numbers with a close neighbor, to use in case of emergency.
- Leave a set of spare keys with a trusted neighbor, not under a doormat or planter, on a ledge, or in the mailbox.
- Keep windows, doors and patio doors locked. Always use the peephole to see who is at the door before you open it. Doors feature wide-angle peepholes at heights everyone can use.
- Walk with your keys in your hand;
 they can be used as a weapon in case of an emergency.

- Keep doors and windows locked; this is the first step in staying safe. Check exterior door frames for dry rot, and add deadbolts to all exterior doors. Make sure the doors are made of solid wood or metal, not hollow core doors. Check the window locks, to make sure they are in good working order. Place a wood or metal bar in the lower track of sliding glass doors, for added protection.
- Install a security system or a life alert program. The life alert program is not just for sick or elderly people; it's a great program for those who live alone. It is a monthly program that monitors your well-being.
- Install a motion detector outdoors, to light the walkways and sides of the house. Make sure the porch lights are working.

Trim bushes and plants in front of doors and windows; they can offer a good hiding place for a burglar. ★



9-1-1 Emergency Network



The City of Jersey Village has a new link on the city website which will allow all residents to sign up to receive emergency alerts on their cell phones. In years past, the city could not send emergency information to cell phones. The technology to do this is now available and the City of Jersey Village has partnered with Harris County 911 to allow are citizens to register their cell phones for such alerts when they are sent. On the main city website

located at www.jerseyvillage.info , the bottom left corner has a button as shown below. Please click on this button and it will take you to an explanation page. Once you agree to the statements on this page it will take you to a registration page. There you can input information and register for this service. Some examples of alerts would be to "shelter in place" because of a hazmat scene or maybe the city is experiencing the potential for "flooding" and you want to know this is about to occur. These are just two examples of what we might send out to all phones in our city. Today, many families do not have a home phone and the only phone they have is a cell phone. Please take advantage of this opportunity and register your cell phones today. *

How to Properly Display the American Flag



There can be confusion and questions about how to properly wear and display the American flag, especially around the summer holidays of Memorial Day and July 4th when many people want to display a flag.

Here is what the law says about using the American flag properly:

- It is the universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on building and on stationary flagstaffs in the open. However, when a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness.
- The flag should never touch anything beneath it, such as the ground, the floor, water or merchandise.
- The flag should never be used as wearing apparel, bedding or drapery. It should never be festooned, drawn back, nor up, in folds, but always allowed to fall free.
- No part of the flag should ever be used as a costume or athletic uniform.
- The flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying or delivering anything.
- The flag should never be carried flat or horizontally, but always aloft and free.
- The flag should not be draped over the hood, top, sides or back of a vehicle or of a railroad train or a boat.

- (5) Recommend policies to the city council for guiding action affecting development in the city and its environs; and

(6) Perform other duties that may be specifically assigned to it by the city council that may have a bearing on the preparation or accomplishment of the comprehensive plan.

The City Council invites interested Jersey Village citizens who wish to serve on the Planning and Zoning Commission to complete an application. The Council will review applications received at its August Council meeting, and appoint applicants in compliance with the terms of the Charter. Interested citizens are encouraged to complete an application and submit it to the City Secretary as soon as possible. Only applications received in 2014 will be considered.

- 8. Be informed about social media and follow/friend/ like your child's profiles.
- 9. Use privacy settings on social media sites to limit contact with unknown users.
- 10. Remember that DIGITAL is FOREVER and think before you post, especially inappropriate photos or comments.

Tips for Parents

- 11. To guard against identity theft, never give out your Social Security number.
- 12. Commit all passwords to memory.
- 13. When using an ATM machine, make sure no one is hovering over you.
- 14. When participating in an online auction, try to pay the seller directly with a credit card so you can dispute the charges later.

- 15. Adopt an attitude of healthy skepticism toward websites that offer prizes or giveaways.
- 16. Choose a commercial online service that offers parental control features.
- 17. Tell your children never to give out their address, telephone number, password, school name, or any other personal information.



Comprehensive Planning CPAC Meeting Update

On August 14, 2014 Freese and Nichols Inc. and the Comprehensive Planning Advisory Committee (CPAC) held a meeting regarding the City of Jersey Village's comprehensive plan. A financial presentation was given to the CPAC committee by the City's finance director Isabel Kato. The presentation provided the committee members with an overview of the city's finances.

Shad Comeaux of Freese and Nichols Inc. provided the committee with a comprehensive plan process update. The meeting centered on information from the online surveys and the recent roundtable session that were held last month at the City's Civic Center. Mr. Comeaux navigated the committee towards goal development. All the ideas and suggestions from the surveys and roundtable session were reviewed and the committee gave Freese and Nichols its feedback and direction for obtainable goals for the plan. The CPAC will meet again on August 28, 2014 to finalize their draft goals and strategies.



Why is Recycling Important to us as a Community?

Keeping Garbage Out of Landfills

Recycling helps keep garbage out of landfills. Much of the waste in landfill sites is not biodegradable, meaning that it will stay in its existing form in the landfill site for many years. This means that the landfill sites become full and new sites need to be found. In addition, gases and chemicals are released as materials in landfills decompose, which causes air pollution. Reducing the amount of waste will help control gases generated, which will mean better air quality.

Another key reason why recycling is important is that it often saves energy. For most items, it takes less energy to process the recycled materials than it does to use new materials. For instance, it takes significantly less energy to recycle paper than it does to create paper

from new woodland. Energy from nonrenewable resources is protected and saved for future generations.

One important feature of recycling that affects us all is the fact it can save money. Processing costs incurred by waste management companies are reduced, and manufacturing costs are reduced, resulting in cost savings being passed on to the consumer.

Recycling is one of the few processes that we can all participate in as a community, that requires minimum effort, yet it has far reaching and long lasting benefits. Tascon Industries Inc. will continue to provide recycling collection for the City of Jersey Village. Recyclable materials will be collected every Wednesday, and include paper, aluminum cans and plastics. We would like to encourage all of our residents to participate in the program!

City of Jersey Village Budget Update

After several months of preparation, the budget process for the City of Jersey Village is in its final stages. City council will conduct a public hearing and formally adopt next year's budget at its Regular meeting on Monday, September 15, 2014. Prior to adoption, city council will conduct a public hearing to receive citizen comments and preview next year's budget. The budget will be effective for the next fiscal year, which begins October 1, 2014 and ends September 30, 2015.

Property tax rates are projected to remain at \$0.7425 per \$100 of valuation. The current Property Tax Rate has been in effect since 2006. The Jersey Village City Council remains committed to providing the highest level of service to city residents, consistent with available resources. The budget not only funds specific services and programs, but also establishes priorities for the coming year.

The Budget is composed of two parts, the Operating Budget and the Capital Improvement Program. The Operating Budget funds the daily operation of the city and is the larger of the two The Capital Improvement budgets. Program Budget incorporates projects undertaken to insure the long-term viability of the city. Next year's proposed budget incorporates programs to repair and upgrade water and sewer plants, continue park improvements, and initiate bridge repairs

Vehicle Burglary Prevention Tips



Always lock your doors!

Many burglars are after an easy opportunity and will only target vehicles with unlocked doors, skipping locked cars. Locking your car doors does not guarantee you won't be

a victim, but it is the first and easiest deterrent.

Record serial and model numbers

Frequently stolen items such as car stereos, GPS devices, amplifiers, etc. are often never recovered because the serial and model numbers were not written down and recorded.

• Secure any valuables

Remember that your car's locked doors or windows will not deter a criminal if they spot valuables inside. Remove anything valuable from your vehicle or hide them in the trunk so a burglar cannot see them. Make sure that you remove or hide high-value items such as GPS systems, mobile devices and tablets, laptops, purses and so on. A burglar will often look into a

car first to see if there is anything worth stealing and will skip cars that appear to be empty.

Hide the remote for your garage door opener

You know that garage door remote you keep handy on your sun visor? It's an excellent way for a burglar to get into your house without being detected — especially if you don't lock the interior door between your house and garage. Make sure you hide the remote in your car (e.g., the glove box) or take it inside with you.



Civic Center for Rent

Did you know that the City rents out the Civic Center for meetings, weddings, anniversaries, birthdays, graduations, reunions, scouts, little league, Garden Club, AARP, American Legion, and many more events?

The Civic Center is a large room located between City Hall and the Police Department with a stage and tables and chairs to accommodate approximately 200 people. Rates are highly competitive, averaging 1/3 to 1/2 the cost of similar facilities. Residents who use the Civic Center will receive a discount. For a social gathering/party for residents the deposit is \$250 and the rental fee is \$350. There are additional fees for bringing food or drinks in the building as well as for alcohol.

Halloween Safety

Kids love Halloween! They get to dress up and get lots of free candy. There are many ways to keep your child safe at Halloween, when they are more prone to accidents and injuries. The excitement of children and adults at this time of year makes them forget to be careful. Simple common sense can do a lot to stop any tragedies from happening.

COSTUMES:

- Costumes should be fire proof with their name and address attached
- Keep costumes short to prevent falling
- Use make-up instead of a mask
- Light in color or add reflective tape on their costumes

TRICK OR TREATING

- Go in groups and always parents in the group
- Tell children to only stop at familiar homes where the outside lights are on
- Take a flashlight and pick welllighted streets
- Make sure your kids know to NEVER enter houses or a stranger's car



TREATS

- Do not eat any treats until you get home
- Check out all treats at home in a welllighted place
- Only eat unopened candies and other treats that are in original wrappers
- Don't forget to inspect fruit and homemade goodies for anything suspicious

PARENTS AND ADULTS SHOULD:

- Establish a curfew for older children
- Clear porches and placing jack-olanterns away from doorways
- Drive slowly
- Exit driveways carefully

Make Halloween a fun, safe and cheerful time for your kids and they will carry on the tradition that you taught them to their own families some day!

MOSQUITOS— Fight the Bite!

While there are a variety of repellents that give you effective protection against mosquitoes, there are other measures you can take to help protect you and your family.

Peak Mosquito Hours

Be mindful that the hours from dusk to dawn are peak biting times for many species of mosquitoes. Remember to use insect repellents and protective clothing during evening and early morning. (See diagram above)

Appropriate Clothing

Clothing can help reduce mosquito bites. When weather permits, wear long sleeves, long pants, and socks when outdoors. Mosquitoes may bite through thin clothing, so spraying clothes with a personal insect repellent will provide extra protection. Remember to only use a repellent product that is labeled for use on clothing and consult the label for full use directions. Also consider wearing loose, light-colored clothing as mosquitoes are more attracted to darker colors.

Standing Water

Mosquitoes breed in standing water, so removing it from your property reduces your risk. Areas like rain gutters, old buckets or tires with stagnant water are all possible breeding sites.

- **Drainage Systems** Remove leaves and any debris that may have collected in your gutters and other drainage systems so water flows out freely.
- **Decorative Elements** Change or flush out water from birdbaths,

fountains, etc. at least once a week to prevent mosquitoes from breeding.

• Open Cavities Recycle or store tires (or other items with open cavities) so they won't collect rainwater.

Active Sports

Believe it or not, just breathing can attract mosquitoes. They are drawn to carbon dioxide, which you release when you exhale. Additionally, people give off two mosquito attractants — body heat and lactic acid (a substance your body emits when you perspire). Stay protected when you're participating in sports or other outdoor activities that may make you breathe harder.



SPEEDING...A Neighborhood Problem

You hope cell phone reception is OK to dial 911 AND you hope the ambulance doesn't take 20 minutes to get there. What do you do now?



A strong wind blows a large tree into your neighbor's house. They knock on your door and say they smell a strong odor of gas inside. They are afraid it will catch fire, or explode. Can you do anything before the fire truck arrives?

Wouldn't it be great to know what to do in these situations? The Citizens' Fire Academy will equip you to handle most every-day emergencies that confront you,



your family, andyour neighbors. Plus, you get to try all that gear our fire fighters use! The Fire Academy is open to anyone over 18. Participation in any session is always voluntary and no one will be asked to do anything that makes them feel uncomfortable. All sessions are taught by the members of our JV Fire Department. There is no cost to attend and all materials are provided. Plus, there is no homework or tests!

The classes start in January 2015 and the academy is about 12 weeks in length. We meet at 7:00 PM on Thursdays for 2½ - 3 hours at the Fire Station with an occasional Saturday. Please Call the Fire Department Administrative Offices at 713-466-2130 for more info, or to register. ★

Tips to Help Ensure That Trash Gets Picked Up

Please have trash out at curb by 7:00 AM on the day of pick up. All trash may be out no sooner than 5:00 pm the day prior to trash collection and out of public view by 7:00 am the morning following the pick up day.

On each regularly scheduled collection day, WCA will collect residential refuse located curbside. Curbside refuse must be either in containers or bags not exceeding 40 GALLONS or weighing over 40 POUNDS.

Trees, shrubs, brush trimmings and fencing must be bundled in lengths no greater than 4 feet with no branch diameter exceeding 3 inches. The bundling is required to allow quick pickup and size limitations are required to avoid damaging the equipment in the crushing process.

Items such as appliances, furniture, carpet (up to 1 room ONLY, rolled up

four feet wide and less than fifty pounds), cardboard boxes (flattened), will be picked up either day. By Federal Law, refrigerators and freezers or any other items containing Freon must be drained of Freon and have an accompanying bill to validate such service was performed.

ITEMS EXCLUDED FROM COLLECTION ARE DIRT, ROCKS, BRICKS, CONCRETE, TIRES, BATTERIES, MOTOR OIL, COOKING OIL, WASTE GENERATED BY A PRIVATE CONTRACTOR OR ANY MATERIALS OR ITEMS DEEMED HAZARDOUS MATERIAL. WCA will leave a tag explaining the reason for non-collected item(s).

WCA will meet with the resident to determine a price for the pick up of items excluded for normal trash collection.

Crime Prevention Tips when at Home

- Never open your door automatically. Install a peep hole.
- Lock your doors and windows.
- Vary your daily routine.
- Use "Neighborhood Watch" to keep an eye out on your neighborhood.
- Don't leave notes on the door when going out.
- Leave lights on when you are away for an extended period.
- When you are away, cancel all deliveries and arrange for your yard to be mowed.
- Arrange for your mail to be held by the Post Office, or ask a neighbor to collect it for you.

- Be wary of unsolicited offers to make repairs to your home.
- Deal only with reputable businesses.
- Keep an inventory with serial numbers and photographs of resalable appliances, antiques and furniture. Leave copies in a safe place.
- Don't hesitate to report crime or suspicious activities.
- Install deadbolt locks on all your doors.
- Keep your home well lit at night, inside and out; keep curtains closed.
- Ask for proper identification from delivery people.
- If a stranger asks to use your telephone, offer to place the call for him or her yourself.
- Never let a stranger into your home.
- Do not hide your keys under a mat or in other conspicuous places.

Fire Safety for the Holiday's

The Holiday's season is upon us and we need to be thinking safety. Here are safety rules you can follow:

Preventing Christmas Tree Fires

Selecting a Tree for the Holiday

Needles on fresh trees should be green and hard to pull back from the branches, and the needle should not break if the tree has been freshly cut. The trunk should be sticky to the touch. Old trees can be identified by bouncing the tree trunk on the ground. If many needles fall off, the tree has been cut too long, has probably dried out, and is a fire hazard.

• Caring for Your Tree

Do not place your tree close to a fireplace or heat vent. The heat will dry out the tree, causing it to be more easily ignited by flame or sparks. Keep the tree stand filled with water at all times.

Holiday Lights

• Maintain Your Holiday Lights

Inspect holiday lights each year for frayed wires, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinking or wear before putting them up. Do Not Overload

Electrical Outlets

Do not link more than three light strands, unless the directions indicate it is safe

Do Not Leave Holiday Lights on Unattended

Holiday Decorations

• Use Only Nonflammable Decorations

All decorations should be nonflammable or flame-retardant and placed away from heat yents.

• Never Put Wrapping Paper in a Fireplace

It can result in a very large fire, throwing off dangerous sparks and embers and may result in a chimney fire.

Artificial Christmas Trees

If you are using an artificial tree, make sure it is flame retardant.

Candle Care

Avoid Using Lit Candles

Make sure they are in stable holders and place them where they cannot be easily knocked down. Never leave the house with candles burning.

Never Put Lit Candles on a Tree

Do not go near a Christmas tree with an open flame - candles, lighters or matches. Finally, as in every season, have working smoke alarms installed on every level of your home, test them monthly and keep them clean and equipped with fresh batteries at all times. Know when and how to call for help. And remember to practice your home escape plan.


