Code Enforcement Reminder: The city ordinances state that a dog is deemed to be "at large" when



it is off the premises of its owner and not under control by leash or chain. Additionally, it shall be unlawful for any person to walk a dog on public property or upon the private property of another without carrying at all times a suitable container or other suitable instrument for the removal and disposal of dog feces. There are no exceptions to this ordinance. *

Why not make "Crime Prevention" one of your New Year's Resolutions

As another New Year approaches almost all of us will make a "Resolution" of some kind. For many it will be to shed some of those unwanted pounds we gained during Thanksgiving and Christmas. For others it may be to get out of debt, be kinder to others, or maybe even give more of our time. Did you ever think about Crime Prevention as a resolution? Crime prevention is everyone's business and involves taking some simple but effective steps to secure your home, and vehicles. Here are a few Crime Prevention tips that you can use to stay safe in the new year.

- 1. If possible, don't jog, walk or drive alone especially at night and in less-populated areas. There is always safety in numbers.
- 2. Properly lock your home including closing your garage door even when you are at home. I can't tell you the number of times I have been dispatched to an incident where valuables (tools, lawnmowers, bikes, toys, etc.) have been taken from an open garage, even when the victim was at home.
- 3. Take the time to record the serial numbers of all your valuables and take photos. If no serial number is available, you may want to consider marking certain items with your state driver's license number.

- 4. Please be sure to listen to that "little voice" inside of all of us. Be aware of your surroundings (law enforcement folks call this "situational awareness") and look for any suspicious persons and activities.
- 5. Don't carry around large amounts of cash or wear glittery valuables. If you need to use an ATM, go to a busy, well-lit location and only withdraw the amount of cash you really need.
- 6. Park your vehicle in well-lit, populated areas. Don't leave your key in the ignition and properly secure your vehicle (i.e. close your windows and lock the doors) when you park. Also, don't leave any valuables in plain sight.
- 7. Get to know your neighbors. In setting-up neighborhood watch programs, it is often said that a so-called "nosy neighbor" is the best home break-in crime fighting device available.

Finally, if you do see anything suspicious, call the police. Many times we hear that someone didn't call because they didn't want to "bother" us. 
The Greater Harris County 911 system provides jurisdictions with an option to do a reverse 911 phone call to residents during emergency situations. These reverse 911 phone calls take our dispatch center about five minutes to implement and send out the first phone call. During the April 18 Tax Day floods, we sent a reverse 911 phone call to the entire city at midnight and the last phone call in the city was sent at approximately 3:00am. The reverse 911 system works best when we select a small area to send a phone call to. If we select the entire city, this chooses every registered phone in Jersey Village. That is business and residential. Because it does call businesses in addition to registered citizens, it extends the time for all phone calls. When city staff is aware of impending weather or conditions that we are monitoring, we can properly plan and send the proper notification

out to warn citizens of the city. Reverse 911 is not used for an immediate notification. The time frame for reverse 911 just takes too long if we try and warn the entire city of an immediate event that is happening such as a Tornado that is spotted on the ground. In January, we had several concerned citizens wonder why we did not do a reverse 911 for impending weather that had a potential for a Tornado. The reason is, Reverse 911 just takes too long to notify everyone. There are several ways currently available to everyone to get notification. When a weather warning is sent by the National Weather Service, they send this over television and radio. Weather radios are available from most retailers and can be set to go off when this alert is sent out. The price for one of these radios ranges from \$15.00 - \$50.00 depending on where you shop.

Tip of the Month - by Matt Jones

"Putting Shouldn't Be So Hard"
The fundaments are really kind of simple:

- 1. Keep the head dead steady the whole stroke.
- 2. The lower body should stay very quiet using arms and shoulders only.
- 3. Always keep the putter absolutely across (perpendicular) the line of putt.
- 4. Make a "putting stroke" not a putting hit. The length of the swing should be approximately the same on the backstroke and the through stroke keeping the same speed.
- 5. Practice Practice Practice all lengths of putts even 2 footers!
 Hope it helps remember the best way to save strokes off your score make more putts.

Long Term Flood Recovery Plan — Public Meeting





This is a Reminder That Trees Need to be Trimmed!



Please make it a point to take a look at your trees and trim any low hanging limbs. Remember once you trim your trees they must be placed at the curb be in bundles no greater than 4-foot lengths and 40 pounds.

Sidewalk Obstructions

Pursuant to the City of Jersey Village, Texas, Code of Ordinances: SEC.14-310

- (6) Landowner responsibilities. The landowner shall be responsible for:
- (e) The owner of a tree overhanging a street or right-of-way within the city shall prune the branches so that the branches will not severely obstruct the light from any street lamp or obstruct the view of any street intersection and so that there shall be a clear space of 13 feet above street surface of [or] eight feet above the sidewalk surface. The owner shall be responsible for removing all dead, diseased, or dangerous trees, or broken or decayed limbs, including tree stumps, which constitute a menace to the safety of the public. Tree pruning shall be done in accordance with accepted arboricultural standards.

Coody Graduates

Lorri Coody, City Secretary, City of Jersey Village, graduated from the Texas Municipal Clerks Certification Program on January 26, 2017.

Graduates complete approximately 200 hours of individual study over a four-course curriculum and attend eight two-day seminars for an additional 100 hours of classroom study. The curriculum includes selected texts and a number of special readings on the topics of public administration, election law, budgeting and finance, municipal law, and personnel management.

The Texas Municipal Clerks Certification Program, located at the University of North Texas, Denton, Texas, is a university-level professional education program for city clerks and city secretaries in Texas. The program is the third oldest of thirty-three such programs in the country.

The Certification Program is recognized and endorsed by Section 22.074 of the Local Government Code, Vernon's Texas Codes Annotated. In 1984, the College Board selected the Texas Municipal Clerks Certification Program as one of sixty-four exemplary professional development programs in the United States.

Texas Registered Municipal Clerks are recognized for their achievements and contributions to effective, efficient local government by their mayors, city administrators, city councils, and the citizens of their communities. ★

Tip of the Month - by Matt Jones



Pitch Your Chip or Flop Your Chip?

It's simple: If you don't have much distance from the edge of the green to the pin, use a lofted club like a sand wedge that will flop the ball higher and hit and roll less. If you have a lot of distance from the edge of the green to the pin then use a less lofted club like a 7 or 8 iron and pitch the ball much lower and roll it most of the way to the pin. I chip with anything from a 5 iron to a sand wedge depending on those two elements. Never use one club to do all your chips. Make the same swing with all the different clubs and become more consistent. Remember practicing your "short game" is the surest way to lower your score. *

US 290 Construction Update

Construction is underway of the section of US 290 from Jersey Drive to Eldridge Parkway, otherwise known as Segment 7. Part of this project involves relocating City utility lines that lie in the path of the roadway. The City's completion date for this project was set for March 31, 2017, pending sewer connection issues near Metro Park & Ride, and weather issues. In addition, by the end of the project, grooved pavement will be installed to help with noise reduction. The entire expansion of US 290 is scheduled to be completed in 2018.

With Jersey Village sitting right in the middle of several major roadways, it's important to realize that construction zones will


always be around us, especially as the Houston Metro area continues to grow. Here are some basic road safety tips to remember when driving in and near construction areas:

- Slow down and watch for construction detours

Safety Concerns of Old Wiring a message from JVFD

Recently a resident called and was concerned about older wiring in their home. Specifically, the wiring behind the meter was arcing and their concern was the age of the home and the older wiring. According to a 2009 study by the National Fire Prevention Association, faulty wiring is the most common cause of house and apartment fires in the United States. As fire codes and building codes improve over time, electrical wiring becomes more safe long-term. However, any wiring over 40 years old should be checked by a qualified electrician periodically. This is a worthwhile investment for a household's safety and peace of mind.

If your house is approaching older age, residents will want to keep aware of some simple signs that there may be a problem with electrical wiring in the walls.

Five Electrical Wiring Warning Signs

Sign 1: Breakers and Fuses Go Out Regularly

Circuit breakers help to protect the house from fire by "tripping" when the circuit begins to overload by exceeding the number of amps the circuit is rated for. Circuit breakers do wear out over time and, as they trip more often, they can sometimes go bad.

Sign 2: Dimming and Flickering Lights

Dimming and flickering lights are a sign of an overloaded circuit. However, even on good wiring, dimming or momentary flickering is normal in some cases. If it happens often, however, this may be a sign of faulty wiring or a bad circuit breaker that needs to be replaced.

Sign 3: Buzzing, Charred, or Discolored Outlets and Switches

Buzzing, charred, and discolored outlets or light switches are a very bad sign of a potentially dangerous situation. In some cases, faulty wiring in the circuit, usually near the outlet or switch, or a loose connection on the switch is the cause and causes a short. This causes the outlet to arc and make a small, short-lived mini fire that causes the outlet's surface to char or discolor from heat buildup.

Sign 4: Burning Smell

A burning smell in a home with no identifiable source can be scary. In some cases, the short is in the outlet, but if it is in the wiring inside the wall, it can more easily catch surrounding materials on fire. Either way, homeowners should turn off the circuit breaker or remove the fuse for that circuit until the electrician can examine the circuit.

Sign 5: Shocking Switches and Outlets

Shocking switches or outlets are a good indicator that the switch or outlet is bad. Sometimes, however, it means that there is a wire in the circuit shorting out to the conduit enclosing the wires. Aside from being physically unpleasant, this is a sure sign that something is shorting out. It could be a device plugged into the plug, the plug or switch itself, or a wire that has lost its insulation. If devices are removed or replaced and it still happens, the outlet or switch should be examined or replaced, and it would be a good idea to have the wiring examined as well. **

Spring Safety Tips

It's a little early, but spring is in the air. Rain showers, Texas Bluebonnets are blooming and the police department is seeing more and more people spending time outside with family and friends. Jersey Village is a wonderful city that has the reputation of being a wonderful place to raise a family. With amenities like golf, swimming, parks, walking and bike riding trails, and not to mention the relatively low crime lifestyle our city enjoys. This is due to active effective police patrols, thorough investigations and the crime prevention practices of our citizens. We can drive the crime rates even lower though further protecting our families and property. The steps are easy for everyone to help out.

- Report suspicious activity in your neighborhood. Report it immediately so police can respond quickly. If it is a vehicle, get a license plate number if you can safely.
- As the evenings get lighter and warmer and you go walking at night, take
 your cell phone to report any suspicious activities you may see. Wear something
 reflective and/or bring a flashlight so others (especially cars) can see you.
 Remember, state law requires you to walk on the sidewalk if one is provided. If
 you walk late at night, bring a friend.
- Use outside lighting on your house at night ... front and back. Lights on a residence is a simple and inexpensive deterrent to would be thieves.
- Keep your car doors locked whether in your own driveway or when out shopping or dining. Remember to keep those valuables out of sight. Out of sight, out of mind.
- Keep your garage door closed when you aren't in the garage or driveway.
- If going out of town, submit a House Watch.

Sometimes, all it takes is for one or two incidents in a neighborhood to alarm residents. Keep an eye out for your neighbor's safety, and they will keep an eye out for you.

Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2015. This was the seventeenth consecutive year that the City has achieved this prestigious award. In order to be awarded a Certificate of Achievement, a government must publish an easily readable and efficiently organized CAFR. This report must satisfy both generally accepted accounting principles and applicable legal requirements. We believe that our current CAFR continues to meet the Certificate of Achievement Program's requirements and we submitted it to the GFOA in order to determine its eligibility for another certificate. 




Reminder: City Storm Water System

The "street drains" as they are often referred send any material received into our bayou and then it may end up in the gulf. No citizen should place any items down the street drains including grass clippings and leaves. Any solid making its way into the system can settle and take up space within the bayou drainage structure, thus reducing capacity. Any chemicals making their way into the storm drains can deteriorate the drainage pipe and lead to system failure. If we all make sure the system is clear, it will function as best as it can as designed.

White Oak Bayou Maintenance

The Harris County Flood Control District contracts mowing out along their drainage laterals. Their contract calls for three (3) mowings a year, which means (weather dependent) a mowing April-May, June-July, and August-September. ★

Budgeting

The process for preparing the budget for next year has begun. Over the next several months, city staff and council members will engage in a series of meetings and work sessions to develop the fiscal year 2018 budget. Formal adoption of the budget for the City is expected to occur at the September city council meeting. The adopted budget lays out the plan for city spending over the period of October 1, 2017 to September 30, 2018

The budget not only provides a blueprint for spending, but assigns priorities and goals for staff relating to city programs and services. A significant amount of time is spent considering capital projects and equipment purchases. This budget season we anticipate discussions on the recommendations from the flood study that is currently underway.

The budget is composed of two parts, the Operating Budget and Capital Improvements. The Operating Budget is comprised mainly of the General Fund. The General Fund is where the city pays for police, fire, and general administrative operations. After the General Fund, the two largest funds in the city are the Utility and Golf Course Funds. The Capital Improvement Budget includes projects related to Sanitary Sewer Treatment and Collection Improvements, Water Production/Distribution Improvements, Street and Drainage Improvements, and General Community Improvements.

As you can see, municipal budgeting is a complex process that has many moving pieces and parts. We welcome citizen input into the process. All meetings associated with the budget process are public meetings. Notices of budget meetings will be posted to the city's web site. Financial information regarding current or past budgets may also be found at the city's web site within the Finance section.

Summer is Almost Upon Us

Our neighbors are out mowing their lawns for the first time since the winter, and the kids are out and about riding their bikes and playing ball. City Accepts Parking Permit Applications Beginning August 1, 2017

The Cy-Fair ISD 2017-18 school year begins August 28, 2017. The City will begin accepting applications on August 1, 2017 for parking permits that allow certain residents to park on certain city streets within the school zones during the 2017-18 school year.

In 1999 City Council passed an ordinance providing exceptions in the no parking/tow-away zones on certain City Streets. The ordinance established a permit system, which, upon application, issues two parking permits. A person may park a motor vehicle, which displays the issued permit, on

the street in front of the address on the permit. The parking permit is issued annually upon application at no charge; however, replacement permits are \$25.00 each.

Long Term Flood Recovery Study Update

The Long Term Flood Recovery Study that is being done by Dannenbaum Engineering is nearing completion. Right now Dannenbaum is in the third phase of the study, which is the Preferred Alternative Selection and Finalization. At the end of this portion Dannenbaum will make a presentation to the City Council and the community on recommended steps that can be taken to create a flood damage reduction plan that balances social acceptability with economic, hydraulic, and environmental feasibility. The plan will identify both short-term and long-term flood damage reduction projects that can be designed and implemented as funding allows.

There are several structural flood damage reduction measures that are being evaluated. They include bridge improvements, channel improvements along the White Oak Bayou Main


Channel, and the South Fork of the White Oak Bayou, storm water detention facilities, including modification of the Jersey Meadows Golf Course, and local street drainage assessments.

City officials and representatives from Dannenbaum are also looking at ways the projects that will be recommended can be paid for. The City will be working closely the Harris County Flood Control District and other state and federal agencies in an attempt to secure funding to help implement recommendations that come from the study.

Public feedback and participation is welcomed throughout the duration of the study, and attendance at the public meetings is encouraged. The final public meeting will be held on June 27th at 7pm at the Civic Center. We hope you will join us for this meeting.

Garbage Collection Guidelines

WCA collects household waste every Tuesday and Friday for Jersey Village. Please ensure that you are following these auidelines:

- Please place trash out at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection. All trash may be out no sooner than 5:00 p.m. the day prior to collection.
- Please do not place trash in the street or block public walkways.
- Curbside garbage must be in trash bins, or bags not exceeding 40 gallons, or weighing over 40 pounds.
- Tree limbs, shrubs and brush trimmings must be bundled and tied in lengths no greater than 4 feet, with no branch exceeding

- 3 inches in diameter. The bundling is required to allow for quick collection, and size limitations are required to avoid damaging compacting mechanism on the truck.
- Hazardous materials, such as batteries, motor oil, cooking oil, pesticides and chemicals will not be collected.
- Items such as dirt, rocks, concrete, tires, and waste generated by construction projects will not be collected.
- **Please remember that recycling carts provided by WCA are only to be used for recyclable materials for collection on Wednesdays. Regular household garbage placed in recycling carts will not be collected.** ★

Summer Water Usage



Just a friendly reminder that we are in the hot month's cycle. For those that water their yards, flower beds and other plantings; it is best to water early in the morning or later towards evening. The city does have a ration plan if things do get too bad, but any rationing will come with notification. If we all do our part, we can continue to have beautiful landscaping while minimizing water loss. Cooperation is appreciated.

Deed Restrictions vs. Zonong Ordinances

On a regular basis, city staff receives questions from residents concerning the differences between a deed restriction and a city zoning ordinance. They often wonder why their neighborhood deed restrictions are not being enforced by the City.

First, it is important to note that the rules and regulations that apply to land use are very complex. However, on a very basic level, deed restrictions are private, contractual covenants which limit land use. Deed restrictions are placed on real property by the owner of the property, for the benefit of that property only, and typically are placed with the intent to enhance the value of the property. In establishing deed restrictions, there are no limitations except for compliance with laws and public policies. Nonetheless, established restrictions affect subsequent owners of the real property for a stated term, and for any extensions.

In addition to deed restrictions, an owner of land may also agree to another typical land use constraint known as a covenant. Covenants impose obligations upon landowners either to do, or not do, certain acts. There are two

types of covenants, restrictive covenants and personal covenants. Restrictive covenants are those that "run with the land" and are enforceable. Personal covenants are not enforceable.

Generally, deed restrictions and restrictive covenants, may not be enforced by a city. The exception is for a city that has not adopted zoning regulations, and which elects to enforce the restrictions, such as the City of Houston. To learn more about the City of Houston's deed restriction enforcement program, visitwww. houstontx.gov/legal/deed.html.

Since deed restrictions are not automatic, someone must seek to enforce them. Typically, that person will represent one of the following

- 1. The developer of the project;
- 2. The representative of a corporation set up to represent the property owners; or
- 3. An individual property owner. In connection with item (2) above, a representative of a corporation set up to represent the property owners is typically a homeowners' association or a property owners' association. These associations:

a. have a membership primarily consisting of the owners of the property covered by the dedicatory instrument for the residential subdivision; and

b. manage or regulate the residential subdivision for the benefit of the owners of property in the residential subdivision.

Zoning ordinances provide the police power to protect the health, safety, and public welfare of the community. This is a legislative power exercised by the City. Therefore, the goal of zoning is the protection of the community through regulation of land use that is focused on the benefit of the whole community. These zoning restrictions are enforced by the city and violations constitute Class C misdemeanors.

In Jersey Village, where the city exercises zoning authority over land subject to deed restrictions and covenants, both sets of land use rules apply. In applying both, if there is an inconsistency, the more restrictive land use requirement controls. It should also be noted that some land use practices that may be valid under a deed restriction or restrictive covenant are outside the scope of the city's zoning authority.

Long Term Flood Recovery Plan Update

In late June, the Long Term Flood Recovery Team conducted a public meeting in order to present study findings and to make recommendations for moving forward. Thank you to everyone that came out to the meeting. The final study report, which is still being compiled and should be presented to the Council in August, will incorporate the comments and feedback from citizens received before, during and after the meeting.

Dannenbaum Engineering was hired to use the best available data and actual slab heights to model and recommend to the City Council what they considered preferred solutions. Harris County provided Dannenbaum all of their data in regards to the White Oak Bayou watershed. Dannenbaum also received input from the citizens and consider what people experienced and had questions about. They were to emphasis the structures and other features within the city to best determine priorities. There were many requests for information outside the city that were not in their scope of work. Neither Dannenbaum nor the City of Jersey Village has authority to direct changes outside of the city limits/ETJ.

The Long Term Flood Recovery Team recommended both structural and non-structural solutions. The structural solutions include: golf course detention,

improvements to the White Oak Bayou Channel in coordination the Harris County Flood Control District, and Wall Street Neighborhood Storm Sewer System Improvements. The non-structural solutions include home elevations or buyouts and participation in the Community Rating Program. The total estimated cost for recommended structural projects is \$11,100,000, broken down as follows: \$750,000 for the golf course detention; \$4,600,000 for the Channel Improvements; \$2,000,000 for the Wall Street Neighborhood storm sewer improvements; and \$3,750,000 for the Wall Street improvements.

The non-structural recommendation of buyouts and/or elevations would have a local cost of \$2,400,000 to \$2,800,000.

All of these structural and non-structural recommendations, when taken together, would have large benefits to Jersey Village. If all of the recommended solutions are implemented the plan would remove 26 homes from the 25 year floodplain, leaving no homes in that floodplain. For a 50 year flood, it would remove 87 homes from the flood plain, removing 84.5% of the homes from that floodplain. At a 100 year flood, 62 homes would be removed from the flood plain, which is 38% of the homes in the 100 year floodplain. In

another Tax Day Flood situation it would remove 26 homes from the floodplain.

With the study wrapping up, staff is busy researching and working on grant opportunities to help fund some of these projects.

Some of the projects, like the channel improvements, fall under the jurisdiction of the Flood Control District. Any work done within their channels must allow for 0.00% impact upon the properties north and south of Jersey Village. The Flood Control District does have a project along White Oak Bayou running through Jersey Village. That project will only be started when funds are available and each phased project along White Oak Bayou is completed from the outflow north and west. We are working with them to help move these projects forward.

The Council will continue to discuss the projects as we move through the budget season, and citizens are encouraged to be a part of that process as well.

City of Jersey Village Tax Rate Adoption

After a series of public budget meetings, the City of Jersey Village Council will adopted the budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 after conducting a public hearing on September 18th at 7:00 P.M. The budget will be effective for the next fiscal year, which is October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018.

The City of Jersey Village Council is considering keeping the property tax rate at \$0.7425 per \$100 of valuation. This rate will fund part of the City's General Fund budget based on projected current year's values and allow the timely payments for its Debt Service Fund. The City must follow the State of Texas legislatives guidelines for proposing and adopting a tax rate. If the tax rate proposed by the City of Jersey Village governing body (City Council) exceeds the effective tax rate (a calculated rate

that would provide the taxing unit with about the same amount of revenue it received in the year before on properties taxed in both years), or rollback rate (calculated maximum rate allowed by law without voter approval), whichever is lower, they must publish a new public hearing notice and conduct a series of public hearings. If needed, these hearings are scheduled for Monday October 2 and October 9 both at 7:00 P.M. If they do not exceed these rates, then they may adopt the tax rate on Monday October 16th at 7:00 P.M. The Tax Rate is split in two parts, the M&O (Maintenance and Operation) tax rate and I&S (Interest Sinking or Debt Service) tax rate.

We need to keep an eye out for children in our neighborhoods. Be aware that smaller children may pop out from behind parked cars or cannot be seen due to their size. Here are some safety tips for the new school year.

Work out a safe route to school with your parents. Chose the quickest way with the fewest street crossings and intersections with crossing guards. Stay away from parks, vacant lots, fields, and other places where there are not many people around.

Walk to and from school with a friend, neighbor, brother, or sister, do not go by yourself. Never talk to strangers or accept rides or gifts from strangers. Remember, a stranger is anyone you or your parents do not know well or don't trust.

Be sure you know your home phone number and address, the number of your parents at work and of another trusted adult, and how to use 911 for emergencies.

If you bike or skateboard to school, wear a helmet. Do not forget to lock up your bike wherever you leave it. If you are home alone after school, check in with a parent or neighbor as soon as you walk in the door.

Walk the route your children are going to take to school and show them where trusted adults live on the route. Let parents and friends know if you stay late after school. Get permission first if you want to play with a friend instead of going home. Always let parents or trusted adults know if you see something that is not right.



Recycling Reminder

- Carts should be placed at the curb with the arrows on the lid facing the street.
 This ensures that the automated truck can easily access and empty the recycling cart.
- Please recycle only acceptable materials. All recyclable materials may be mixed together inside the cart. Foliage, branches, wood and grass clippings are not considered recyclable items. - Cardboard boxes must be broken down. Items placed outside of your cart will not be collected. Maximize space in your cart by crushing plastic bottles and aluminum cans.
- Ensure that all of your cans and bottles are empty before recycling them to avoid contamination of other materials.
- For extensive recycling, a 2nd recycling bin may be requested. To request an additional bin, please call 713-466-2133.
- Recycling carts provided by WCA are for recyclables only; not regular trash.
 Regular trash should be placed at the curb on Tuesdays and Fridays only.
 Trash put in recycling carts will not be collected.





Know the City Codes

The city's Code Enforcement division enforces the city code enacted by City Council to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Jersey Village. Code Enforcement works to prevent and abate nuisances on private property such as illegal dumping, weeded lots, graffiti, signs, trash and litter, and others.

Help us keep Jersey Village beautiful and safe by becoming familiar with the city code requirements and by reporting violations. To report violations, call the Public Works Department at (713) 466-2110 or the Code Enforcement Officer at 713-466-2129. Two of the city's code requirements are described below.

Tree Branches, Limbs, and Cuttings for Trash Collection

Tree limbs, shrubs, hedge cuttings, and rubbish shall not exceed four feet in length and shall be prepared in units or pieces less than 50 pounds in weight and placed at curbside for trash collection.

Heavy trash collection day is your first pickup day each week. Any garbage, branches and rubbish placed for trash collection shall not be visible from a public street prior to 5:00 p.m. of the day preceding the day of collection.

Garage Sale Signs

Garage sale or personal property sales may be advertised by one non-illuminated, temporary ground sign not exceeding four square feet in size and five feet in height. The sign advertising the sale can be placed only on the property where the sale is occurring. Signs that are affixed to trees, utility poles, posts, fences, etc., are prohibited, and will be removed immediately by the Code Enforcement division.

A garage sale sign can be in place for two days prior to the sale. The sign shall be removed within 24 hours following the end of the sale. No permit shall be required for such a sign.



- Never give your Social Security Number or bank account information over the phone. Charities will not ask for this type of information. You can either ask them to send an envelope for a check, give via PayPal or use a credit card (not debit).



Municipal Court Administration Receives Ceertification

Court Administrator, Paul Rex, of the Municipal Court in Jersey Village, Texas has completed all of the requirements for Level III of the Municipal Court Clerk Certification Program and was awarded the title of Certified Municipal Court Clerk on September 21, 2017, by the Texas Court Clerks Association (TCCA) in conjunction with the Texas Municipal Courts Education Center (TMCEC), the Texas Municipal Courts Association (TMCA), and Texas State University—San Marcos. Paul Rex has served in the Jersey Village Municipal Court since December 13, 2010.

To qualify for the title of Certified Municipal Court Clerk, clerks must complete the requirements for Level I, Level II, and Level III. These requirements include completing 40-hours of continuing education and passing a four-hour exam at each level. Additionally, to complete Level III, clerks must also attend a 24-hour Assessment Clinic, complete 40-hours of court observation, submit a journal of those observations, and attend a 12-hour court administrator seminar. The Level III exam questions are taken from 15 books, covering the following topics: diversity management, total quality management, facilitation skills, performance appraisals, hiring and supervising procedures, office management, records and caseflow management, budgeting and financial management, cost analysis, court collections,

leadership, organizational effectiveness, communication, implementing change, and managing Human Resources.

TCCA is a non-profit professional association of municipal and justice court clerks and administrators. Its purpose is to increase the proficiency of judicial administrators and clerical personnel through education and the exchange of ideas. Founded in 1972, TCCA is an affiliate of the Texas Municipal League and offers its members a variety of services and programs.

TMCEC is a project of the Texas Municipal Courts Association (TMCA) and is funded by a grant from the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals. TMCEC provides judicial and legal education for municipal court judges, clerks and prosecutors through monthly regional seminars and an (800) telephone line. TMCA is an association composed of municipal judges, clerks, prosecutors and court support personnel. It monitors legislation, attorney general opinions and changes in case law to ensure that the 918 municipal courts in Texas remain up-to-date on the law.

The Texas State University is located in San Marcos. An agreement between Texas State University-San Marcos, TCCA, and TMCEC was signed in January 2003 making the University a co-sponsor of the Certification Program.

Holiday Safety Tips

As the holiday season approaches we here at your Jersey Village Police Department wish to take a moment and pass along some, "Holiday Safety Tips." The holiday season is always a special time of year but it is also a time when people get so busy, they become vulnerable to thefts and other holiday crime. We can never be too careful, too prepared or too aware. Please share this information with family, friends and neighbors. The Jersey Village Police Department wishes you a safe, happy and peaceful holiday season.

Driving

- Keep all car doors locked and windows closed while in or out of your car. Set your alarm or use an anti-theft device.
- Park as close as you can to your destination and take notice of where you parked.
- Do not leave packages or valuables where they are visible. This creates a temptation and opportunity for thieves. If you must leave something in the car, lock it in the trunk or put it out of sight.
- When approaching or leaving your vehicle, be aware of your surroundings.
- Do not approach your car alone if there are suspicious people in the area.
- Ask mall or store security for an escort before leaving your shopping location.

Shopping

- Shop during daylight hours whenever possible. If you must shop at night, go with a friend or family member.
- Even though you are rushed and thinking about a thousand things, stay alert to your surroundings.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Pay for purchases with a check or credit card when possible.
- Notify the credit card issuer immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused.
- Be extra careful if you do carry a wallet or purse. They are the prime targets of criminals in crowded shopping areas, transportation terminals, bus stops, on buses and other rapid transit.
- Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion to avoid mishaps.
- Beware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, "con-artists" may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or belongings.

At Home

- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave the house, even for a few minutes.
- When leaving home for an extended time, have a neighbor or family member watch your house and pick up your newspapers and mail.
- Indoor and outdoor lights should be on an automatic timer
- Large displays of holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows and doors of your home.
- If you are leaving for any amount of time, let me remind you to place your home on the department's House Watch. Just call the police department at (713)466-5824 to be placed on this list.
