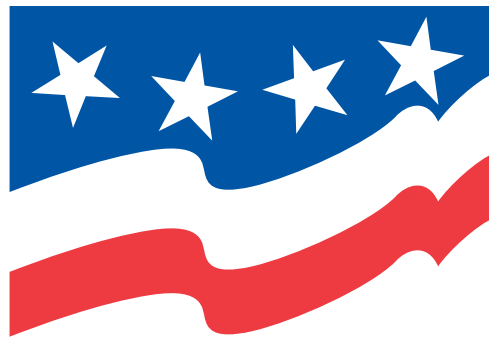

The Jersey Village Citizens' Fire Academy is open to anyone over the age of 18. This program is designed to give the citizens of Jersey Village an opportunity to learn about their emergency services provider and gain valuable safety and health education. Participants will be put through training

similar to that of a beginning firefighter, as well as skills needed for CERT (Community Emergency Response Team). There will be no cost for this course and all materials necessary will be provided to the student.

Participation in any section of the class is voluntary; students will not be asked

to do anything that will make them feel uncomfortable. Two Saturday training sessions will be scheduled; one for vehicle rescue, with the Jaws of Life, and the second is a live fire exercise at a local fire training field. Classes will be taught by members of the Jersey Village Fire Department.

All classes will begin at the Jersey Village fire station located at 16501 Jersey Drive, in the training room. ★

City of Jersey Village Solicitor Rules

In layman’s terms, the following rules apply to solicitation within Jersey Village: Any individual, firm, organization or corporation is prohibited from engaging in the taking of orders, the sale of commodities, services, or the solicitation of subscriptions or donations from house-to-house or place-to-place without a permit from the city. There are a few exemptions from this in the case of a noncommercial or nonprofit purpose or cause. Solicitors must wear or display an identification card provided by the city. Solicitors may only solicit during the hours of 9:00am-8:00pm and 9:00am-9:00pm during daylight savings time.

If there are deviations from these rules, or you have doubts about the person conducting the solicitation, please contact the police department at the non-emergency number (713-466-5824) and an officer will be dispatched to your location. Common Code Violations

The following are a few of the items commonly reported to, or noted by, Code Enforcement:

1. Construction and / or repairs without required permits. Examples; Building, Electrical, Plumbing, Mechanical Permits for Sheds, Fences, Additions, Driveways, Irrigation, Re-roofing and Interior renovations etc.
2. Vehicles, Boats and Utility trailers not properly parked or stored on property and on streets.
3. Trash, grass clippings, and tree limbs etc. being placed for collection at the curb before 5pm on Mondays and Thursdays.
4. Garage sale signs, realtor, and contractor signs placed in the city right of way (between the curb & sidewalk).
5. Lost cat or dog signs being placed on light poles or stop signs.

6. Yard maintenance (high grass).
7. Dogs being allowed to run at large.

If you have any questions regarding code violations, or would like to report a violation, please call 713-466-2129 between the hours of 8 am and 5 pm Monday - Friday. If a code enforcement issue arises after hours, residents should contact the dispatcher on duty at 713-466-5824. If the issue is deemed to be an emergency, dispatch will send a police officer to address the problem. If it is not considered to be an emergency, the Code Enforcement Officer will be notified of the call and will address upon returning to the office.

By following the proper procedure city personnel will be able to address Code Enforcement Violations in a timely manner so that abatement proceedings, if necessary, may begin judiciously. ★

Teaching Youth Cyberethics

At the Jersey Village Police Department we make it a priority to keep all children safe. From toddlers to teens, our kids should be able to grow up in a healthy environment free from predators. One of those environments that is especially prevalent in our society is the internet. Just as protecting youth from dangers on the Internet is important, so is protecting the Internet from young people who might abuse it. As parents, caregivers, teachers, and adults, you work to teach youth Internet safety by telling them to keep their personal information safe and avoid predators, but it's just as important to teach youth cyberethics.

Teaching teens about the ethical treatment of others on the web and of websites and intellectual property (such as music, videos, and written materials) in cyberspace can help prevent cybercrime. While youth who commit cybercrimes may realize that their actions are wrong, they may not know that their Internet behaviors are illegal. Cybercrime is categorized in the following three ways:

- The computer as a target (using a computer to attack other computers);
- The computer as a weapon (using a computer to commit a crime); and
- The computer as an accessory (using a computer to store illegal files or information).

These categories include crimes such as launching viruses, storing illegal files (such as child pornography), committing fraud, infringing copyrights, and pirating software, among others.

Many youth commit cybercrime by:

- Downloading and sharing copyrighted video and music files;
- Harassing others via chat bots (computer programs designed to imitate human conversation); and
- Hacking into school computer networks to deface websites, enter sites that the school forbids, or change grades.

The best way to prevent youth from committing cybercrimes is to educate them about ethical and legal rules of the Internet, and the emotional and financial costs of cybercrimes to victims. Moreover, cybercrimes carry real consequences. Teach youth that their actions in cyberspace are not anonymous, and that real people are affected by their crimes. 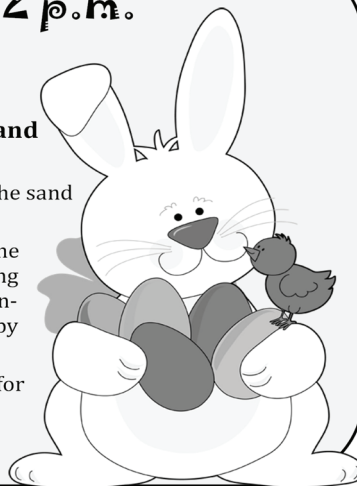
Carol Fox Park

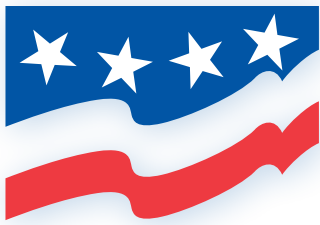

Tips on Taking Care of Your Home this Spring

The sun is shining and the birds are chirping... it's springtime! Here are a few spring home maintenance tips that will have you primed to keep your home at its best this spring:

1. Check Your Gutters – Winter storms and autumn leaves can clog up your gutters, preventing your home from draining properly. Visually inspect your gutters and clear away any leaves or debris so you're all ready for those "April Showers".
2. Air Filters – Now is a great time to change the air filters on your heating and cooling systems to clear away the winter dust and ensure you'll have fresh air throughout your home. Air filters should be changed approximately every three months (although some air filters require monthly changes – check the documentation on your air conditioning unit and heating system to find out what air filters to use and when to change them).
3. Prep Your Lawn for Spring – Clear away any leaves, debris and weeds you may

have missed over the winter – you'll give your lawn room to breathe and grow

4. Check Your Batteries —With the coming of each new season, make it a habit to test out the batteries on your smoke and CO2 detectors.
5. Cut Shrubs and Trees – To prevent your plants from impacting your home, trim overgrown trees and shrubs. Tree branches should be about 7 feet away from your home.
6. Oven and Stove Top – Run the cleaning cycle on your oven and thoroughly clean your stove top to prevent built-up grease from becoming a fire hazard.
7. Fire Extinguisher Check-Up – Check, test and replace your fire extinguishers as needed. Check the gauges on each unit to ensure they are charged and ready for use.

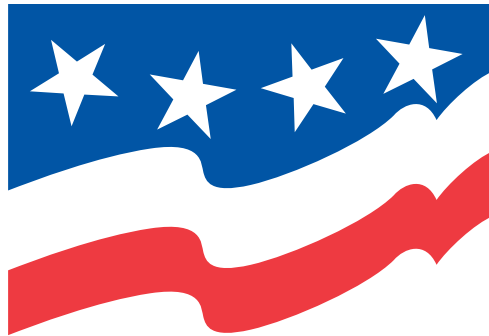

How to Prevent Identity Theft and Fraud

There are several Golden Rules when it comes to preventing others from using your identity. To prevent this type of crime you should understand that protecting your social security number is one of the single best preventative measures you can take. Be very weary of online companies and pop-up ads that ask for your social security number. Also, banking institutions never ask for social security numbers by email. These are two of most prevalent forms of getting access to your social security numbers.

Shred your documents. You would be surprised at how much personal information that you throw out. Bank statements, billing statements, insurance paperwork and many other items you receive in the mail have some portion of your personal identity on them. There are many people who go through trash or landfill just looking for this type of information.

Secure your phones and computers with strong passwords. Both of these items contain your personal information and can be easily

accessed by leaving them open to others. Monitor your credit and financial statements. These are usually the first places that trouble shows up. Be quick to act on irregularities that you observe. Some banks even have online alerts when your debit/credit card is used so you can track it being used. The sooner you catch a problem the easier it is to fix and the damage is limited.

Scams, or fraudulent business practices are on the rise too. One local favorite is the person calling saying they are the IRS, City-State-County Department, or some financial institution demanding payment over the phone for something immediately. Some scammers even call saying you have relative in the hospital or jail and they need money now to get treatment or be released. Try not to fall for these scams. Nothing is so important that you can't verify the validity by calling a local person or visiting a company in person. ★

This is a Reminder That Trees Need to be Trimmed!

Please make it a point to take a look at your trees and trim any low hanging limbs. Remember once you trim your trees they must be placed at the curb be in bundles no greater than 4-foot lengths and 40 pounds.

Sidewalk Obstructions

Pursuant to the City of Jersey Village, Texas, Code of Ordinances: SEC.14-310

(6) Landowner responsibilities. The landowner shall be responsible for:

(e) The owner of a tree overhanging a street or right-of-way within the city shall prune the branches so that the branches will not severely obstruct the light from any street lamp or obstruct the view of any street intersection and so that there shall be a clear space of 13 feet above street surface of [or] eight feet above the sidewalk surface. The owner shall be responsible for removing all dead, diseased, or dangerous trees, or broken or decayed limbs, including tree stumps, which constitute a menace to the safety of the public. Tree pruning shall be done in accordance with accepted arboricultural standards. ★

Storm Water Education

If you observe pollution violations:

Stormwater is precipitation that does not soak into the ground, but instead runs off the surface. As stormwater flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt and other pollutants. Stormwater flows directly into storm sewer systems and water bodies such as lakes, streams, rivers, wetlands, or coastal waters. In most cases, whatever enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the water bodies we use for swimming, fishing, and drinking water supply.

KEEP OUR STORM DRAINS CLEAR OF TRASH & DEBRIS

When grass clipping, leaves, or other debris are washed or dumped into our storm sewer inlets, drainage can be delayed or blocked. To prevent this, sweep up grass clippings from paved surfaces and dispose of them properly. Compost or mulch yard waste when possible. Rake leaves regularly so they remain out of the streets and gutters. Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly so excess chemicals do not

wash into the storm drain and pollute water bodies. Ensure all trash and recyclables are properly secured and disposed. Performing these standard practices will help keep the storm sewer clean from pollutants and help prevent flooding.

STORM DRAINS ARE FOR RAIN WATER ONLY

By practicing healthy household habits, homeowners can keep common pollutants off the ground and out of the storm sewer system. Clean up spilled fluids with absorbent materials and don't rinse into a nearby storm drain. Recycle used oil and other automotive fluids at service stations. When walking your pet, pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly. Whenever possible, drain your pool or spa into the sanitary sewer system. Adopt these healthy household habits and help protect our water bodies.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!!!!!!

These markers assist in preventing pollutants from entering the storm sewer system by means of illegal dumping. This volunteer activity is a requirement outlined in the City's Storm Water Management Program. 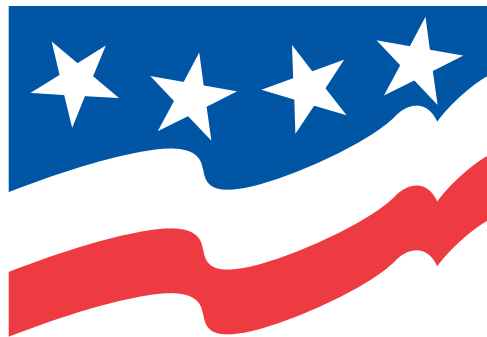

Spring Code Enforcement Issues

Before we realize it, Spring will be here, and the sound of lawnmowers will fill the air. A few points to consider before the yard maintenance season begins in earnest. Grass must not be allowed to exceed 12 inches in height. Code enforcement personnel understand most of us are not going to mow a yard after eight straight days of rain, however, every effort should be made to mow your yard as soon as possible thereafter. Yard clippings should not be placed at the curb for pick up any sooner than 5:00 PM the day before collection. That's 5:00pm Monday and 5:00pm Thursday. Most of the problems we see with early placement at the curb come from landscape companies. It is the resident's responsibility to educate their respective landscape service provider about Jersey Village ordinances. Please make the effort

to ensure your landscaper does not blow clippings into the street drainage outlets. We are a community that has experienced flooding in the past. We are our own worst enemy when we allow our yard crews to blow grass and weeds into the storm water drainage system.

Many of you are contemplating home improvement projects for the Spring. If you are considering new fencing or a new patio, please contact the permits desk regarding the permitting process. You may reach them at 713 466-2110. It is not terribly difficult to obtain a permit, and a courteous gentleman will insure your efforts meet local and national building codes. If you are planning on repainting your house, no permit is required. ★



Home Safety

With the Easter Holiday approaching, there will be many who will be travelling and leaving their homes to go spend time with family. The Jersey Village Police Department asks that you keep the following home safety and crime prevention tips in mind:

- Ensure that all the windows in your home are locked and properly secured. There are also inexpensive secondary window locks that can be purchased at any hardware store.
- Before leaving on your trip, double check all doors to confirm that all entry points are secured.
- Leave a light on inside your home on each floor so that it appears that someone is home.
- Make sure the alarm system is armed before leaving your residence.
- Lighting is a very good deterrent. Leave a light on outside by the main entrances to your home along with any other flood lights you may have around your home. If your lights are connected to a timer, make sure the timer is set at the appropriate times to maximize lighting.
- Remember that you can add your residence with the Jersey Village Police Department's House Watch program to have officers drive to your

residence and check for any suspicious activity or damages.

- We encourage all residents and businesses to sign up with the Jersey Village Police Department website where you can access helpful links like: Extra Patrol Requests, Vacation House Watch Requests, Add Your Residence to the No Solicitation List, and Pay Your Alarm Permit Fee.

These are some basic tips that can make a criminal think twice about targeting your home and avoid being a victim of a burglary or theft. On behalf of the Jersey Village Police Department, have a safe and Happy Easter!

Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR)

The Comprehensive Annual Financial Report of the City of Jersey Village for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2017 was submitted after an extensive and meticulously audit by our external auditors.

Our auditors, Belt Harris Pechacek, LLP have issued an unqualified ("clean") opinion on the City's financial statements for the year ended September 30, 2017. The independent auditor's report is located at the front of the financial section of this report. Management's discussion and analysis (MD&A) immediately follows the independent auditors' report and provides a narrative introduction, overview and analysis of the basic financial statements. The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) awarded a "Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting" to the City of Jersey Village for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2016. This was the eighteenth consecutive year that the City has achieved this prestigious award. In order to be awarded a Certificate of Achievement, a government must publish an easily readable and efficiently organized CAFR. This report must satisfy both generally accepted accounting principles and applicable legal requirements. We believe that our current CAFR continues to meet the Certificate of Achievement Program's requirements and we submitted it to the GFOA in order to determine its eligibility for another certificate.

Tip of the Month – by Matt Jones

“Practice Properly” It’s spring and it’s time to commit to a little practice time. I suggest to “practice properly.” I see so many people loading their big heavy golf bag out to the range with a big bucket (110 balls). They grab a 7 iron, hit a few and then pound the driver for the other 80 balls!

Here is the proper way to practice: (1 ½ hour)

1. Always warm up with a dozen sand wedges.
2. Then hit 6-12 balls starting with your wedges and continue through EACH club up to the driver. That is approximately your large bucket
3. Always end your practice with a few sand wedge shots just like you started. This “should” take 45 minutes if you don’t rush each shot.
4. Take all your wedges and go to the short game practice area and practice 60-80 short shots (and bunker shots) of all different lengths.
5. Grab all clubs and go to our practice green and putt a minimum of 15 to 20 minutes to finish your practice session. Practice all lengths, even 2 footers!!

Proper practice = quality practice = lower scores. Matt Jones

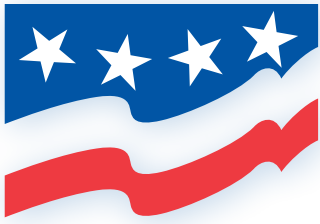

Code Corner

Code Enforcement is a very important part of the Public Works Department. Our Code Enforcement Officer, Gordon Gibson is in charge of overseeing that all the city's ordinances and codes are being followed, not only by residents but by contractors (hired by home owners) as well as businesses along the 290 Highway. The Code Enforcement Officer is also responsible for animal control, which is in itself a huge task.

Contractors are working in our city everyday, performing tasks such as installing new water heaters, driveways, roof work, new pools, and sprinklers systems. All require that a permit be pulled by the home owner or the contractor. This insures that all parties involved are protected. Contractors will provide proof of insurance and licenses for the work they are doing. This will protect home owners against using someone who is not licensed in their field (electrical, pool repair) to do work.

The Code Enforcement Officer drives around the city to make sure that all jobs have the correct permits pulled. While on inspection if the contractor does not have the required permits, work shall be stopped or the contractor will be asked to comply with the city's ordinance and go to city hall to obtain a permit. This is not meant to be an inconvenience, but to protect home owners

and make sure the ordinances and codes are being followed.

In addition, the Code Enforcement Officer checks for trash being put out too early, and tree limbs that are not trimmed causing branches to hit vehicles. Signs that are placed in the right of way are picked up. Empty lots are looked at to make sure they are in compliance with the city's ordinance. The business districts are looked at to see if any new construction is being done and that the required permits are pulled.

On a different note, we've all had a time when our pets have gotten out and disappeared for some time before we were able to track them down. It's very important that any residents who have pets register them with the city. You will receive a pet tag for your pet to wear around his/her collar. If your pet does decide to "take a walk" and he/she is picked up by the code enforcement officer he can quickly return your pets. In some cases we have picked up animals with no tags and have to wait until we are called by a resident to see if we have picked up their pet. Pet tags are only \$2 a year (they have to be bought annually) and proof of rabies vaccination must be presented. ★

Swimming Pool and Spa Water Discharge Guidelines

Swimming pools and spas can contain significant levels of chlorine or other chemicals used for disinfection or cleaning purposes. If this water is discharged into the storm sewer system untreated, these chemicals could cause damage to water quality, aquatic life, and wildlife.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) is the state's environmental agency protecting the public's health and natural resources. The TCEQ created regulations on what can discharge into a storm sewer system. Swimming pool and spa discharges are included in these regulations and must be free of chlorine and other chemicals prior to entering a conveyance system. The City of Jersey Village is a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4). The City has the authority and responsibility to regulate all public stormwater conveyance systems (such as swales, streets, inlets, outfalls, and detention basins) within the City boundary. In order to comply with the TCEQ regulations, swimming pool and spa discharges are regulated through the City's Ordinance. ★

- o Runoff or Return Flow from Irrigation
- o Waterline Flushing
- o Discharges from Portable Water Sources
- o Uncontaminated Ground Water
- o Foundation and Footing Drains
- o Air Conditioning Condensation
- o Crawl Space Pump Water
- o Residential Vehicle Washing
- o Street Washing
- o Fire Fighting Emergency Activities
- o Dechlorinated Swimming Pool Discharges
- o Non-Storm Discharges 40 CFR

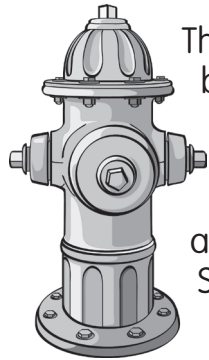

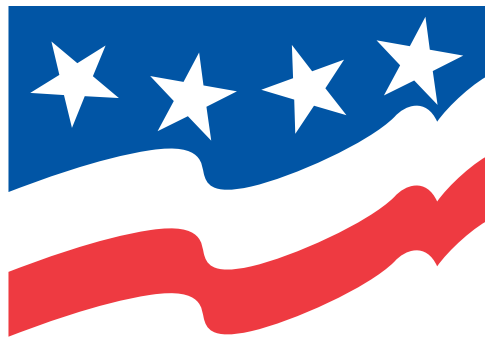
water appear brownish. If you experience this, just let the water run for a while as that will flush out any residue remaining. Appreciate your assistance and understanding. ★

The Jersey Village City Council is accepting applications to fill the unexpired term for Position One on the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone No. 2 Board (TIRZ). The term for Position One began on January 1, 2018 and will expire December 31, 2019.

The responsibilities of the TIRZ are as follows:

- ★ Make recommendations to the city council regarding the administration of the Zone.
- ★ Make recommendations to the city council regarding agreements that are necessary or convenient to implement the project plan and reinvestment zone financing plan.
- ★ Make recommendations to the city council regarding agreements with local governments or political subdivisions for management of the zone or implementing the project plan and reinvestment zone financing plan.
- ★ Make recommendations to the city council regarding the expenditure of TIF Fund Number 2 funds related to development and redevelopment of land within the zone, in conformance with the following process.

- ★ Acting as the lead entity in working with other boards and commissions regarding incentives, regulations, infrastructure, and all other physical and economic development decisions related to the Zone.
- ★ Providing a progress report to the city council annually, or as requested by the city council.

The City Council invites interested Jersey Village citizens who wish to serve on the TIRZ to complete an application. The Council will review applications

received at its June Council meeting, and appoint applicants in compliance with the terms of the Charter. Interested citizens are encouraged to complete an application and submit it to the City Secretary as soon as possible.

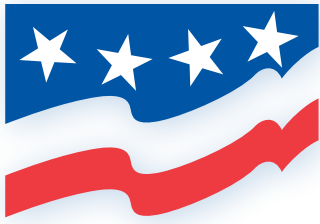

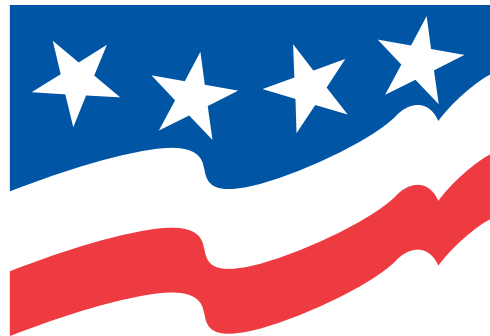

Code Corner

This ordinance is one of the general regulations for all districts, and it prohibits any usage that disturbs the movement of traffic on public street right-of-way, public sidewalk, or any adjacent properties. This is to prevent any disturbances to regular traffic.

Sec. 14-88. - Regulations that apply to all districts.

(a) General regulations

(2) No use of public street right-of-way or public sidewalk or adjacent property, either private or public, shall be permitted if that use inhibits or hinders the movement of normal traffic on that street or sidewalk. Vacation/Travel Safety Tips

Summer is the peak time for many people to go on vacation, and thieves know this as well. Before leaving on vacation you should make sure that all of your doors and windows are locked. Make sure to also check all entry points to your garage and second story windows. If your vacation is going to be for several days, it is encouraged to stop the delivery of mail so that your home won't appear to be alone and let your neighbors know you are going to be on vacation. Make your home look like someone is there by leaving a light on inside your home on a timer to go on and off at specific times. Let a neighbor use your drive-way while you are gone so that it always appears that someone is at home. Remember that you should add your residence with the Jersey Village Police Department's House Watch program to have officers drive to your residence and check for any suspicious activity or damages. This can be done online through the JVPD website: Jerseyvillagepd.org or by calling

Police Dispatch at 713-466-5824.

When vacationing, try to have only a set amount of debit/credit cards that you will use to make purchases. Cash should be carried in small amounts on your person so that you do not display large amounts of cash when paying. You should always travel with two forms of legal identification in case you lose one or that ID gets stolen, preferably a passport. NEVER carry your

Social Security Card as it is not a form of legal identification. Most importantly, stay off of your electronic devices and pay attention to your surroundings when in large groups of people.

You can never be too careful, therefore, the Jersey Village Police Department wants to make sure that your home is safe and that you are safe while travelling. ★

Code Corner

This ordinance requires landowners to maintain their landscaped areas in an appropriate and healthy manner, free from disease, pests, weeds, and litter. Maintenance of landscaped areas include, but not limited to, weeding, watering, fertilization, pruning, mowing, edging, mulching. This is to maintain a clean and pleasing image within the community. Sec. 14-310. - General standards.

(6) Landowner responsibilities. The landowner shall be responsible for:

(a) The regular maintenance of all required landscaped areas and plant materials in a vigorous and healthy condition, free from disease, pests, weeds and litter. This maintenance shall include weeding, watering, fertilization, pruning, mowing, edging, mulching or other needed maintenance, in accordance with generally accepted horticultural practice.

Garbage Collection Guidelines

WCA collects household waste every Tuesday and Friday for Jersey Village. Please ensure that you are following these guidelines:

- Please place trash out at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection. All trash may be out no sooner than 5:00 p.m. the day prior to collection.
- Please do not place trash in the street or block public walkways.
- Curbside garbage must be in trash bins, or bags not exceeding 40 gallons, or weighing over 40 pounds.
- Tree limbs, shrubs and brush trimmings must be bundled and tied in lengths no greater than 4 feet, with no branch exceeding 3 inches in diameter. The bundling is required to allow for quick collection, and size limitations are required to avoid damaging compacting mechanism on the truck.
- Hazardous materials, such as batteries, motor oil, cooking oil, pesticides and chemicals will not be collected.

- Items such as dirt, rocks, concrete, tires, and waste generated by construction projects will not be collected. ★
- **Please remember that recycling carts provided by WCA are only to be used for recyclable materials for collection on Wednesdays. Regular household garbage placed in recycling carts will not be collected.****

Preventing Scams and Fraud

Many times we may fall victim to
scams because we just want to be
the nice person, or are just friendly
at heart. According to the Better
Business Bureau, the following steps
are some indicators or red flags that
you can be aware of to prevent being
a victim of a scam or fraud. They are as
follows:

- Never give out personal banking
information, credit/debit card
numbers, or especially Social Security
numbers to anyone who has called.
Popular scams usually are people
calling to provide a new health
product, a charitable donation, or to
tell you that you are a sweepstakes
winner.

- If someone calls from a
"government agency," it is most likely
that it may be a scam. Request from
them something in writing from a
certified letter to verify it is an official
request.

- If a salesperson does not provide
you with their company name,
address, or telephone number do not
do business with that person.

- Never pay anyone up front before
the job you hired them to do is done.
Many times, criminals will ask for
the money up front to go purchase
material or tools and never return
back to do the work.

- Place yourself on the National
Do Not Call Registry by calling
1-888-382-1222 or by visiting
www.donotcall.gov to also limit
telemarketers from calling.

Code Enforcement Basics

The City of Jersey Village maintains a vigorous code enforcement program for the benefit of its residents. The city has a full-time employee who splits his duties between code enforcement activities and animal control matters. In any given month, the city will send out between 60 and 80 formal notices to residents concerning violations of the city's codes. More significantly, the Code Enforcement Officer will spend dozens of hours in phone conversations and visits to homes to gain compliance without having to take formal action.

For some residents, the speed with which a problem is identified and action is taken is not quick enough. A primary tool that is used by the Code Enforcement Officer is persuasion. For 95% of the issues brought to the city, a phone call to the source of the problem is all that is necessary to gain compliance. On those rare occasions when a phone call is not enough, a written notice is sent to the offending party. For most code violations, the laws of the State of Texas require the city to provide the offending party ten days to remedy the problem. For some offenses, a thirty-day window is provided. It is often the case that when a complaint is registered with the city, the resident has already been sent their 10-day notice. Only in the most extreme cases will the city take the step of turning a violation over to the municipal court for resolution. A fair and active code enforcement program begins with the residents. Do your part by understanding the codes. A link to the codes is provided on the city's web page. We encourage residents to report violations to the code enforcement officer as soon as practicable. ★

The Cy-Fair ISD 2018-19 school year begins
August 27, 2018. The City will begin
accepting applications on August 1, 2018
for parking permits that allow certain
residents to park on certain city streets
within the school zones during the 2018-19

In 1999 City Council passed an ordinance

So to help ensure they have a safe Halloween your JVPD would like to pass along some safety tips when it comes to trick or treating in the city.

1. Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.
2. Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
3. Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.

4. When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

Code Corner

This ordinance dictates the time and placement of trash. All bags, trash cans, and materials shall be placed between the public street and sidewalk in front of the residence for collection, or a different location approved by the Public Works Director. It should not be placed on any part of the public sidewalk. All bags, trash cans, and materials should only be placed out after 5:00PM prior to the day of collection and before 7:00AM after the day of collection.

Sec. 54-73. - Placement and location; time for placement.

On collection days, all bags, trash cans and material prepared as set out in subsections 54-43(b) and (c) shall be placed for collection at ground level between the public street and the sidewalk in front of the residence, or at such other location specified by the director of public works for the residence. Bags, trash cans and material prepared as set out in subsections 54-43(b) and (c) shall not be placed on any part of the sidewalk for collection, and shall not be placed for collection or visible from a public street prior to 5:00 p.m. of the day preceding the day of collection or after 7:00 a.m. of the day following the day of collection. The city will not be responsible for collection of bags, trash cans or material prepared as set out in subsections 54-43(b) and (c) if the bags, trash cans or material are not placed at the appropriate place for collection by 7:00 a.m. on collection day. Each month we share information related to general types of code violations, common code violations, and code to everyone should be aware of. This is a Reminder that Trees Need to be Trimmed!

Please be aware that city staff have been receiving calls regarding low hanging tree limbs and branches throughout the city, including from the CFISD and our own Fire Department – both having trouble maneuvering school buses and fire equipment apparatus, respectively, around some low-hanging tree growth. Please make it a point to take a look at your trees and trim any low hanging limbs. Remember, once you trim your trees, trimmings must be placed at the curb in bundles no greater than 4-foot lengths and 40 pounds. It is important that our residents maintain tree clearances, both above the sidewalk where an 8 ft. clearance is required, (11 ft. suggested) and at the street where a 13 ft. clearance is required, (16 ft. suggested) in order to allow safe movement of both people on the sidewalks, and vehicles, emergency and otherwise, on the streets. We also encourage you to work with your neighbors,

particularly the elderly, to facilitate compliance. By working together we can continue to improve Jersey Village.

Sidewalk Obstructions

Pursuant to the City of Jersey Village, Texas, Code of Ordinances: SEC.14-310(6)(e), the owner of a tree overhanging a street or right-of-way within the city shall prune the branches so that the branches will not severely obstruct the light from any street lamp or obstruct the view of any street intersection and so that there shall be a clear space of 13 feet above street surface of [or] eight feet above the sidewalk surface. The owner shall be responsible for removing all dead, diseased, or dangerous trees, or broken or decayed limbs, including tree stumps, which constitute a menace to the safety of the public. Tree pruning shall be done in accordance with accepted arboricultural standards. ★

Holiday Safety Tips

As the holiday season approaches we here at your

moment and pass along some, "Holiday Safety
Tips." The holiday season is always a special time of
year but it is also a time when people get so busy,
they become vulnerable to thefts and other holiday
crime. We can never be too careful, too prepared or
too aware. Please share this information with family,
friends and neighbors. The Jersey Village Police
Department wishes you a safe, happy and peaceful
holiday season.

Driving

- Keep all car doors locked and windows closed while in or out of your car. Set your alarm or use an anti-theft device.
- Park as close as you can to your destination and take notice of where you parked.
- Do not leave packages or valuables where they are visible. This creates a temptation and opportunity for thieves. If you must leave something in the car, lock it in the trunk or put it out of sight.
- When approaching or leaving your vehicle, be aware of your surroundings.
- Do not approach your car alone if there are suspicious people in the area.
- Ask mall or store security for an escort before leaving your shopping location.

Shopping

- Shop during daylight hours whenever possible. If you must shop at night, go with a friend or family member.
- Even though you are rushed and thinking about a thousand things, stay alert to your surroundings.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Pay for purchases with a check or credit card when possible.
- Notify the credit card issuer immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused.
- Be extra careful if you do carry a wallet or purse. They are the prime targets of criminals in crowded shopping areas, transportation terminals, bus stops, on buses and other rapid transit.
- Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion to avoid mishaps.
- Beware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, "con-artists" may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or belongings.

At Home

- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave the house, even for a few minutes.
- When leaving home for an extended time, have a neighbor or family member watch your house and pick up your newspapers and mail.
- Indoor and outdoor lights should be on an automatic timer.
- Large displays of holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows and doors of your home.
- If you are leaving for any amount of time, let me remind you to place your home on the department's House Watch. Just call the police department at (713)466-5824 to be placed on this list.

Storage of Recreational Vehicles in Jersey Village

On July 1, 2009, The City of Jersey Village implemented Ordinance 2009-22 concerning the storage of recreational vehicles within the City limits. The specific language of this Ordinance is as follows: Section 14-88 (6) (a) - Recreational vehicles (manufactured or home-made) including, but not limited to, motor homes, mini-motor homes, travel trailers, 5th wheel trailers, camping trailers, boat trailers, other trailers used for recreational purposes only, truck campers, all-terrain vehicles and all types of watercraft including boats (motorized or propelled by any other means) shall not be parked or stored in front or side yards in zoning districts A, C, C-2, or D except for temporary periods of time not exceeding seven days within a 30-day period. A recreational vehicle shall not be parked or stored in a rear yard in zoning districts A, C, C-2, or D unless such

vehicle is screened from public view by a solid wood or opaque fence. Nothing in this ordinance is intended to preclude the construction of a properly permitted building that will enclose and screen recreational vehicles.

Ordinance 2009-22 did provide a ten (10) year "grandfather clause" for recreational vehicles or watercraft greater than eight feet in height provided that owners had the vehicles lawfully parked or stored on their lots on May 1, 2009 and had registered the vehicle in the City's Recreational Vehicle Registration Program. The ten (10) year Recreational Vehicle Registration Program ends June 30, 2019 and is closed to new registrants. Current registrants in this program must secure storage arrangements for their "grandfathered" vehicles effective July 1, 2019 or become subject to Ordinance violations. ★

Candle Use During the Holiday Season

During the holiday season, burning candles are used extensively both for decorative and ceremonial purposes. The following tips can help keep you and your home safe during the holiday season.

- Always keep burning candles within sight.
 - Use candles only in rooms where there is a responsible adult awake to control and oversee the flame.
 - Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or before going to sleep.
 - Do not use candles in sleeping areas.
 - Keep candles away from combustibles such as clothing, books, Christmas trees, decorations, window blinds, and curtains.
 - Keep candles away from high-traffic areas where they can be easily knocked over, including areas accessible to children or pets.
 - Place candles on stable surfaces in sturdy holders that grip the candle securely and won't tip over.
 - Place candles in holders that can't burn and are big enough to collect dripping wax.
 - Keep candles up high, out of reach of children.
 - Use extreme caution if you carry a lit candle, holding it away from clothing and any combustibles that may be near your path of travel.
 - NEVER PUT LIT CANDLES ON A CHRISTMAS TREE.
- Now is a great time to test your smoke alarms and to review your home escape plan so that if in the event of a fire, everyone in your household knows how to get out quickly and safely. On behalf of the Jersey Village Fire Department we wish you and your family a fire safe holiday season. ★

Help Speed Up Play
